Be it Remembered that a regular term of the county court of Lake county, State of Oregon, was begun and held at the court house in Lakeview Oregon, on Wednesday, the 6th day of July, 1910.

In order to conform with the requirements of the law governing the creation of election precincts, the following orders heretofore made creating Lake precinct No. 13 and Port Rock Precinct No. 14 of Lake County Oregon are hereby re-enacted and which read as follows to-wit:

In the matter of the establishment of a voting precinct to be known as Lake Precinct No. 13. It appearing to the satisfaction of the court after a thorough investigation of all facts relating hereto that for the convenience of the people residing at and near the Post Office of Lake in the County of Lake State of Oregon that a voting precinct should be established at that place. It is therefore hereby ordered considered and adjudged that a new voting precinct should be established at that place. It is therefore hereby ordered that considered and adjudged, that a new voting precinct be and the same is hereby established and to be known as Lake precinct, No. 13. and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Lake County, Oregon, thence running west along the north boundary line of said county, to the northeast corner of Twp. 23S., R. 16E., W. M. thence south on the range line between range 16 and 17 E., W. M. to the southeast corner of Twp. 25S., R. 16 E., W. M. thence west on the township line between Twp. 25 and 26 to the northeast corner of Twp. 26S., R. 15E., W. M. thence south on the range line between ranges 15 and 16 E., W. M. to the southeast corner of Twp. 27S., R. 15 E., W. M. thence west on the township line between Twp. 27 and 28 a distance of three miles, thence south on the section line a distance of nine miles, thence east on the section line to the east boundary line of Lake County, Oregon, thence north on the east boundary of Lake County, Oregon to the plane of beginning. That the said Lake Precinct, in the county of Lake, State of Oregon, be for all purposes whatsoever a distinct and separate voting precinct and other precincts of Co., Ore., and that the boundaries of all precinct which are affected by the creation of said Lake precinct, No. 13, be and the same hereby are changed to conform, to the boundaries of said Lake precinct No. 13.

In the matter of establishment of a voting precinct to be known as Port Rock Precinct, No. 14.

It appearing to the satisfaction of this court after thorough investigation of all the facts relating thereto that for the convenience of people residing at or near Fort Rock, in Lake County, Oregon, that a voting precinct should be established at that place. It is hereby ordered, considered and adjudged that a new voting precinct be and the same is hereby established and to be known as Fort Rock Precinct No. 14, and bounded as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of Lake County, Oregon, thence running East along the north boundary line of said County, to the northeast corner of township 23S., R. 16E., W. M., thence running south on the range line between range 16 and 17 E., W. M. to the southeast corner of Twp. 25 S., R. 16E., W. M. thence west on the township line between townships 25 and 26 to the northeast corner of township 26S., R. 15 E., W. M. thence south on the range line between ranges 15 and 16 E., W. M. to the southeast corner of Twp. 28S., R. 16E., W. M. thence west on the township line between townships 26 and 27 to the west boundary line of Lake County, Oregon, thence northerly along the west boundary line of said County to plane of beginning.

That said Fort Rock Precinct No. 14, in the County of Lake State of Oregon, for all purposes whatsoever a distinct and separate voting precinct as are the other voting precinct of Lake County, Oregon, and that the boundaries of all precincts of Lake County, Oregon, which are affected by the creation of said Fort Rock Precinct No. 14, be and the same hereby are changed to conform to the boundaries of the said Fort Rock Precinct, No. 14.

In the matter of the arrangement of the boundaries of all other voting precincts of Lake County.
It is hereby ordered that all other voting precincts not affected by the creation of the voting precinct of Lake, No. 13, and Port Rock, No. 14 be and the same shall remain as heretofore established by law.

In the matter of the Library School fund. It is ordered that the County Treasurer be and be directed to transfer, from the General Fund to the Library Fund, the sum of One

Hundred and Twenty seven Dollars (\$127) for the use of School libraries in Lake County.

In the matter of the reward offered for the arrest and conviction of Ike Harrell, on June 11th, 1910 by the County Judge and which reads as follows:

Whereas on or about June 10, 1910, two honorable young men, citizens of Lake County, were cruelly murdered as alleged, by one Ike Harrell it becomes, therefore, the duty of all good citizens to assist the officers of the law in every possible manner to apprehend the said Ike Harrell so that the majesty of the law shall not only be vindicated and the guilty punished, but that every citizen of Lake County may feel assured of the protection of life and property which is guaranteed him by the State of Oregon.

Now therefore in conformity with law and to the end that justice may be done and the guilty party punished the County Court of Lake County, Oregon, does hereby offer a reward in the sum of One Thousand Dollars for the arrest and conviction of the said Ike Harrell for the murder of said Herbert and Walter Newell.

Done at Lakeview, Oregon, this 11th day of June 1910.

It is hereby ordered that the above order offering the said reward of \$1000 for the arrest and conviction of the said Ike Harrell be and the same is hereby confirmed.

It is, therefore, hereby ordered that said petition be dismissed and the prayer denied.

Friday, July 8, 1910
Court convened pursuant to adjournment. Same officers present, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the matter of the application of Pat Murphy, for a license to sell spirits, malt and vinous liquors and fermented cider, commonly known as hard cider, in less quantities than one gallon, in North Warner Precinct, Lake County, Oregon, for a period of twelve months.

This matter coming on regularly to be heard at this time and it appearing by the paper now on file to the satisfaction of this Court that the said Pat Murphy has complied with the law in all respect, as in such cases required, it is therefore hereby ordered that the Clerk of this Court issue a license to the said Pat Murphy to sell spirits, malt and vinous liquors and fermented cider commonly known as hard cider, in less quantities than one gallon in North Warner Precinct, Lake County, Oregon, for a period of twelve months from this date.

After a partial examination of books of County Officers court adjourned to meet July 11, 1910, at 9 o'clock A. M.

Monday, July 11, 1910.
Court convened pursuant to adjournment. Same officers present. Time of Court on this date spent in examination of County Records. The report of F. W. Payne, County Clerk, showing that the bounty on 77 coyotes and 21 bob cats had been paid in the sum of \$157.50, said report covering the period between May 10, 1910 and July 11, 1910, both dates inclusive, was examined and found to be correct.

Court adjourned to set July 12, 1910.
