Ad appropriation of \$175,000 the state is suggested in an initiative petition filed by W. S. U'kes, of Oregon city, for the maintainance of a state publication entitled "The Oragon Official Gazette." The purpose of this publication is to afford reliable information to the voters of Oregon in relation to the business transacted through the different state offices and institutions.

is event the petition is looked upon with favor by the voters of this state at the general election, it will be insumbent upon the governor to appoint three men of ability to inspect the action of the government official once every two months and cott's. report the result of their investigations in the Gazette. The three are to be selected from the state Grange, the Federation of Labor and different commercial clubs, respectively.

It will be the duty of these three correspondents to visit each state institution and gather data of business transactions of the conditions. Out of the \$175,000 appropriation, \$15,000 is to bonds from destruction. 
