SIRES AND SONS.

J. L. Orent of North Monmouth, Me. has served for forty years in the local church choir. Secretary of War Dickinson gave up a \$35,000 job as attorney for the Illinois Central for a \$12,000 cabinet place.

Frederick W. Carpenter, private secretary to President Taft, was born in Minnesota in 1872. He weighs 130 pounds.

R. J. Gleason, town clerk of Waitsfield, Vt., is said to have served longer than any other similar official in Vermont. He has served fifty-three years and is now eighty years old.

Lord Clifford of Chudleigh is one of the wealthy Roman Catholic peers of England and lately bought the old abbey of Marmoutier, in Touraine, to save it from conversion into a factory.

Oliver Wendell Holmes, associate justice of the supreme court and son of the illustrious author, is sixty-eight years old, with prospects of living beyond the age of retirement. He was wounded three times in three battles in the civil war.

Wilbur and Orville Wright, the American aeronauts, in recognition of their practical solution of the problem of aerial flight, have been honored by the Technical High school of Munich with the honorary degree of doctor of technical sciences.

Dr. Samuel A. Green, ex-mayor of Boston, librarian of the Massachusetts Historical society and secretary of the Peabody Education fund, has just celebrated his seventy-ninth birthday. Dr. Green is a physician, historian and author. He has written a number of historical pamphlets on Boston and surrounding territory.

Culinary Concoits.

Parmesan cheese sprinkled thickly over stewed tomatoes that are later browned in a baking dish gives them an added zest.

Just for a change try filling apples which have been cored ready for baking with orange marmalade or raisins and a little butter and sugar. The result is delicious.

Hard boiled eggs, chopped and covered with a not too rich white sauce that is seasoned with curry, the eggs and dressing served in a ring of boiled rice, is an excellent dinner entree or luncheon dish.

A delicious salad may be prepared from cold duck. Mince the meat fine, adding a small quantity of stuffing to it. Season highly with salt and pepper, stir in a little minced celery and cover with mayonnaise or some similar dressing. Serve on a bed of lettuce leaves.

Rudyard Kipling has practically ceased to write. Charles E. Hallberg of Chicago, once janitor in a bank, but an artist by inclination, has had one of his paintings accepted by the art museum of Guttenberg, the city of his birth.

Victor D. Brenner, the sculptor whose design for the new Lincoln penny was accepted, has been at work upon his model for more than a year and for many months before that had in mind the idea of submitting this design for the coins.

Lorado Taft, who has been awarded the contract for a statue of Columbus to be erected in the plaza of the Union station in Washington and to cost, with a large fountain, \$100,000, is nationally known as a sculptor and has been for several years the leading authority on that branch of the fine arts in Chicago.

Train and Track.

Belgium has been offering reduced rates under certain conditions for travel on its passenger trains, and the change has resulted in enormously increased business and revenues.

The new subway through the heart of Boston's shopping district is the most expensive mile of underground railroad in the world, having cost, with equipment, about \$10,000,000 to build.

Upon their completion, in the near future, the New York Central railroad's freight yards near Buffalo will, it is claimed, be the largest in the country, with a capacity for handling 26,500 cars a day.

Law Points.

A manufacturing company is held in Victor versus Louise Cotton mills (N. C.), 61 S. E., 648; 16 L. R. A. (N. S.), 1029, to have no implied power to insure the life of its president and carry the policy after he has retired from office.

A person who refuses to obey an order which the court has no power to make is held in McHenry versus state (Miss.), 44 So., 831; 16 L. R. A. (N. S.), 1022, not to be guilty of contempt, even though the court has general jurisdiction over the proceedings in which the order is made.
