**WHAT LAW SAYS TO CANDIDATES**  
(Continued from page 1)

statement of accounts and expenses required, by or on behalf of the candidate have been filed. October 23 1910.

Every political committee shall have a treasurer, who is a voter, and he shall keep detailed account of all its receipts, payments and liabilities. Similar accounts shall be kept by every person who receives or expends money or incurs liabilities to the amount of fifty dollars for political purposes and by every political agent and candidate. Every person receiving or expending money or incurring liability by authority or in behalf of such candidate committee agent, or other person or political party or organization shall, on demand, and in any event, within fourteen days after such receipt, expenditure, or incurring of liability, give such treasurer agent or authorized person, proper vouchers; and every payment less in aggregate than five dollars, shall be vouchered for by a receipted bill stating the particulars of expense. Every voucher receipt and account shall be part of the accounts and files of such treasurer agent, candidate or other person shall be preserved by the public officer with whom it shall be filed six months after election.

Any person who is not a candidate who expends money or value greater than fifty dollars to aid in the election of any candidate, party ticket or measure, shall within ten days after election file with the secretary of state, or with the county clerk for county offices, of city official for municipal offices, an itemized statement of receipts, expenditures and vouchers for every sum in excess of five dollars and at the same time deliver duplicate statement and copy of vouchers to the candidate for treasurer of the organization. October 4 and November 18, 1910.

M. S. Barnes, has announced himself as candidate for sheriff of Lake County subject to the decision of the Republicans at the Primary election which will be held on the 21st of this month. Mr. Barnes is at present visiting the northern part of the county and is probably conspiring with the Democratic candidate as to how they can work out the election providing each gets the nomination on their respective tickets and not beat each other for the office. Both men are well known in the county and each have many friends and it will take a count of the votes to decide the question.

The rabbits have been a pest this year and the farmers have been fatiguing them in size shape for the benefit of the sportsman that come out from Lakeview. In order to show their good will to the sportsmen the farmers are cutting out sage brush so that the land, if cleared sufficiently, affords a good shot to the sportsman. The cleared areas will be greatly increased as the hunters arrive and when the land is all cleared there will be some fine sport in the shape of a rabbit drive.

Building in Lakeview is going on steadily with some very substantial homes being erected. Hawley Will Raise the Maine  
Arrangements were made at war department for Captain Hawley, member of the army engineers appointed to remove the wreck of the battleship Maine from Havana harbor to superintend the investigation into the present condition of the wreck. Since the last meeting of the board it has developed that at least some of the members do not look with favor upon the O'Rourke plans for raising the battleship which were given to the president.

One member of the board has expressed himself as believing the plan would not give the board proper opportunity to determine whether the Maine was blown up by an explosion from within or without.

The O'Rourke plan provides for raising the Maine by placing cables underneath the wreck and lifting her bodily out of the water. The army
