Secretary of the Navy Meyer has notified the Oregon congressional delegation that they have the filling of two vacancies at the Annapolis, Md., naval academy, one being a vacancy and the other by graduation. The appointments are to be made by the congressmen.

Gold bullion aggregating \$57,000 in value, a part of a \$170,000 shipment from the Washington Alaska Bank at Fairbanks to the Dexter Horton National Bank of Seattle, was stolen while in transit and lead bars substituted in the treasure box. The robbery is reported to have occurred before the consignment of gold was placed aboard the steamer Humbolt, on which it was to be brought to Seattle.

Judge Bean, of the U. S. Circuit Court, has decided, that A. L. Smith and Minnesota associates should lose title to 37 timber claims in Linn and Lane counties, worth from \$600,000 to \$700,000. This is the first decision in the big timber land case which has been pending for two years. Eight claims involved in the last stages of the litigation were held to be protected by the statute of limitations, and title of Smith and associates to them is affirmed.

In the matter of County roads: The attention of each road supervisor of Lake County is again called to the order made by the court on May, 6, 1910, which reads follows:

In the matter of County Roads: Complaints having been made to the County Court that several of the Road Supervisors of the County have neglected to put the public roads in their respective Road Districts in good condition, and as a result the traveling public are inconvenienced by such neglect of duty of said Supervisors.

In order that there can be no misunderstanding as to the position of the County Court in reference to the construction and maintenance of good roads for Lake County, it is hereby ordered that it shall be the duty of each Road Supervisor of Lake County, Oregon, to make a personal examination of every bridge and culvert in his road district, and to immediately repair or rebuild every bridge or culvert that is required to be repaired or rebuilt; that it shall be the duty of each Road Supervisor to put the public roads, especially the principal traveled roads, in good condition for public travel; that it shall be the duty of each Road Supervisor to consult with the County Court from time to time in reference to the work to be done in his district in order that court may keep in touch as to the work being done and also the amount of money that is being expended in each road district of the County.

The county therefore earnestly requests that each Road Supervisor shall cooperate with the Court in an effort to construct and maintain good public roads for the convenience of the people of Lake County.

It is further ordered that the

County Clerk shall furnish a copy of this order to each road supervisor of the County.

While most of the road supervisors have earnestly co-operated with the County Court in rebuilding bridges, culverts and making substantial improvements of the public highways in their respective districts, yet there are a few supervisors who have not made improvements that should have been made on the county roads; each supervisor is therefore again urged to put the bridges, culverts, and roads in his District in good condition so that the people of Lake County may have the convenience of good public highways.

In the matter of the report of R. A. Paxton and M. D. Hopkins as Road Viewers and S. A. Mushen as Deputy County Surveyor of Lake County, Oregon which report was duly prepared and filed with the County Clerk of Lake County, Oregon, on August 19, 1910, in reference to opening and laying out a County Road in Road District No. 10 of Lake County, Oregon, and the said report having been duly examined, and it appearing therefrom that the opening and laying out of said road is a public necessity. It is hereby ordered that the report of the said Viewers, R. A. Paxton and M. D. Hopkins, and S. A. Mushen as deputy County Surveyor for Lake County, Oregon, in reference to the opening and laying out of county road in Road District No. 10, of Lake County Oregon, be, and the same is hereby approved. It is further ordered that George Nelson, Road Supervisor of Road District No. 10, of Lake County, Oregon, be and he hereby is directed to proceed at once to open said County Road for use as public highway.

Court now adjourned to meet Wednesday, Sept. 14th, 1910 at 9 o'clock A. M.

Payne, County Clerk, showing that from July 11th, 1910, to Sept. 13, 1910, both dates inclusive he had paid scalp bounty on one hundred coyotes and seventeen bobcats amounting to \$184 was examined, found correct and the scalp and front feet of the said animals destroyed as by law provided.

o'clock A. M. of said day or upon their failure to meet on said day then within five days thereafter and then to qualify and immediately thereafter to view, survey and report upon the said proposed road in manner required by law.
