(1) Voters who are opposed to paying taxes on a count of crimes committed in wet towns and cities will vote against the deceptive Greater Oregon Home Rule Association

Practically the same bill, the Reddy bill, was defeated at the last State election by a majority of 12,904 votes. Its purpose is—
First, to exclude the State from all control of the liquor traffic.
Second, to entrench the saloon so that the people could not prohibit it, either by state wide prohibition or county option.
Third to run towns and cities of Oregon wide-open, in defiance of the prevailing sentiment of the people for better conditions throughout the state.

Fourth, it is no American. Cities must not be permitted to make criminal laws not in harmony with the will of the people. Cities and counties are not separate. They rise or fall together. A crime of the city affects the country, as a decayed apple in the box will spoil all it touches. Nothing could be worse than to cultivate crime within the cities; to make legal the wrecking of the farmers sons and daughters; to tax the farmer for court expenses, and to take from him the right of suffrage. The colonization of criminals in cities is the most dangerous element of modern civilization. This amendment will encourage such colonization. The Home Rule Amendment is a financial fallacy. It makes the taxpayer meet the expenses of the vicious and criminal of the city slums, who seldom pay any taxes except as hush money.
If this Home Rule Amendment should pass, all temperance legisla-

tion enacted during the last fifty years would thereby be repealed, and many of our splendid towns and cities on account of the colonization of the vicious element would become cesspools of vice and iniquity.

And save the state from rum rule in cities where the vicious element congregates.
Extract of Argument Favoring a Constitutional Amendment for the Prohibition of the Liquor Traffic
Why put prohibition on our State Constitution? It will take it out of politics. The legislature will not be tempted to tamper with it. The will of the people is hereby made supreme.
The beverage liquor traffic has no divine right, no human right, and therefore should be prohibited by the State Constitution. The passing of this amendment but fixes the principle that the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquor for beverage purposes is wrong, and prohibits it.
The amendment is brief and does not cumber the Constitution.

Many of the statements made and figures presented to this measure are false and entirely without foundation in truth.
State prohibition is but local option enlarged. The state is a unit and the will of the people is supreme. No part of the state should remain unclean if a majority of the people vote for a clean state. No city should legalize crime if a majority of the people of the state vote for better things.
How State Voted on Liquor Question
In 1904 the majority for local option was 3,110
In 1906 the majority against the Liquor Dealers Association was 9,848
In 1908 the majority against Reddy bill (local government bill) was 12,904.
The Reason
The Oregon people are weary of the rum rule. Oregon voters love their homes more than the saloon. The saloon degrades and blights all it touches.

Extract of Argument for the State Prohibition Law
Full argument found on page 125 of State Pamphlet. Why vote for state law, if not all liquor legislation would be in the hands of the legislature. The liquor power cannot bribe the people in Oregon. The people are the law makers. Every law should be framed by its friends. This law has the united support of all the temperance forces of Oregon. It does not affect individual rights and privileges. Its aim is to protect the state from crime. It is framed in the interest of manhood and womanhood. It protects labor. Its provisions are reasonable and sane. It can be enforced.
There will be less blind pigs under this new state wide law than under our present license system. Blind pigs thrive most where liquor selling is legalized. They are discovered, however, more readily under local option. This splendid state law will practically put an end to the blind pig.
