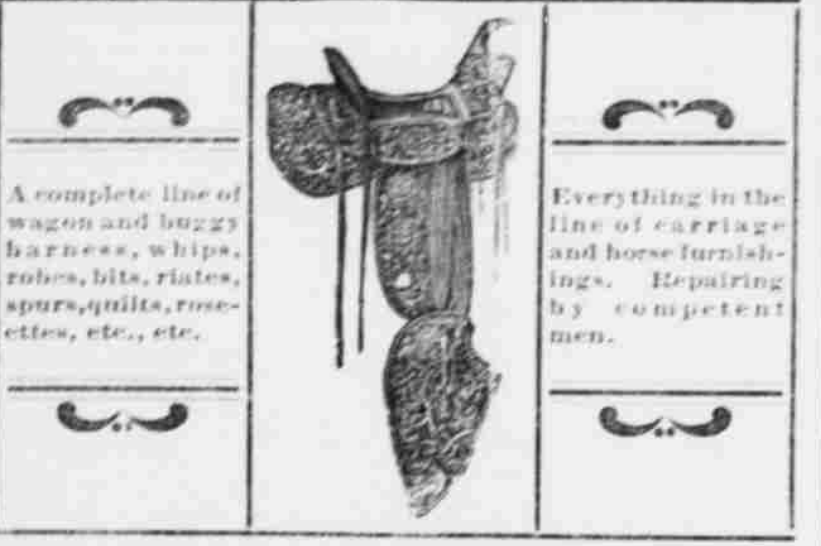

Portland Journal: In refusing to grant the application of the United States to cancel a patent issued to Charles P. Whitney as a homestead from the Roseburg land district, United States Judge Bean announced that in his judgment the United States should not cancel patents that have been issued to homesteaders after the lapse of a reasonable length of time in which suit for cancellation could have been brought.

Demand For Trained Western Men Far Exceeds Supply

Corvallis, Ore., Feb. 25.—Prof. C. I. Lewis, head of the department of horticulture at the Oregon Agricultural College, has had thirteen calls for graduates to fill positions of importance for wealthy corporations and individuals having large orchards, within the past month, which he has been unable to supply, since all of the graduates are either continuing profitable careers of their own, or have already received appointments elsewhere.

Big Dividends Indicate Wholesome Condition Of Trade

Washington, Feb. 25.—Large profits said to be accruing to the publishers of magazines, and business losses being sustained by the government in the transportation of magazines as second-class mail matter at existing rates are made the basis of a statement issued by Postmaster General Hitchcock in response to the attacks made by the magazine publishers on the proposed increase of the postage rate on the advertising pages of the large magazines from 1 cent to 1 cent a pound.

FINE BONUS FOR BIG BALL LEAGUE

Said to Receive \$500,000 For Using Ballon 20-Year Contract

NEW YORK, Feb. 15.—For a bonus, said on good authority to be \$500,000, the National League of Professional Baseball clubs in session here today made a 20-year contract with a leading sporting goods firm of Chicago to use no other baseballs except of its manufacture for the official league ball season of 1912.

A HINDU WIZARD.

His Trick That Puzzled an Occidental Master of Magic.
Some of the tricks of the Hindu wizards are just understanding, according to an accidental master of magic who was speaking of his oriental rival. This is what he says he saw a Hindu wizard do in a club in London.
"He took a board and placed it on four glass pedestals, thus elevating it from the floor. A youngster sitting on the board was requested to place his hands together, palms up. Then the juggler took a glass of water and poured it into the outstretched hands of the boy. In the meantime the boy had been mesmerized, and his attention was fixed on a point indicated by the magician. Gradually the water turned green in color and then developed into a jelly which increased in density until it became as solid as a stone. Out of the center of this appeared the head of a snake, which gradually developed until in the place of the water there appeared a hissing reptile. I was amazed, I can assure you, but the trick was not yet completed. Hitting the reptile upon the head with his wand, the juggler took it up carefully and placed it back in the glass. As we looked it became transformed into a jelly, which in turn melted into a greenish colored water. Clearer and clearer became the fluid until it was of its original color, and then the juggler placed it to his lips and drank the entire contents. This was the most wonderful trick I ever saw performed, and it is as mysterious to me today as it was then."
