The imminent extensions ars: Bi section of Washington by completion of the North Coast from Spokane to Seattle via Lewiston; construction of num erous branches of this line to develop the state; an east and west line across Oregon from Outario on the eastern border through Harney valley to the Paville coast at Crescaut City. Cal., via Lakeview and Klamath Falls, extension of the Northwestern Pacific along the California coast to meet the foregoing line at Crescent City; east and west line across northern central Oregon to Lebauco on the Southern Pacific via Prine ville to connect with Ontario-Cresceut City line near Borns ; extension of the Deschutes line south to connect with the Weed-Natron division

"Other probabilities are a line from Lakevie, Or., south to the Can tral "Pacific at Feruly, an extension from the Southern Pacific at or near Bole, Ariz., Northeast to the company's coal fields at Durango. Cal., Bually extension of the North Platte branch of the Union Pacific Nebraska, now terminating at Northport, across to meet the main live at or near Medicine Bow, Wyo. The last named improvement is assured. It will reduce and eliminate the hard climb from Cheyenne, Wyo., north to Medicine Bow


