any, for road purposes.

Sixth. That the people of each road district select annually a committee of its most progressive and leading citizens to assist the road supervisor in his work, and also to advise with the members of the county court in reference to all matters pertaining to the road district.

The members of the county court are not only willing, but very anxious to render every assistance possible to help in the work of the permanent construction of the public roads. But in order that this great movement for permanent road construction may be a success, I would earnestly request the loyal co-operation of every citizen, who favors good roads, so that Lake County may soon have public highways equal to the best in the state of Oregon.

ADDRESS DELIVERED BY W. H. SHIRK

W. H. Shirk addressed the meeting as follows:

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen:

I regret that the subject given me to talk on this evening, was not put in the hands of some one capable of doing it justice. It is a matter in which I feel very much interested and one which I think is of vital interest to the welfare and development of our county, and I feel that you will concur with me in this statement of the question. The subject referred to is "The Lakeview Board of Trade."

The Lakeview Board of Trade was organized in Lakeview on February 12, 1909. The purpose of this organization was to advertise the resources of all of Lake County, not alone Lakeview or Goose Lake Valley, but the entire county, and I will leave it to you, Ladies and Gentlemen, if this Board of Trade has not proven by every pamphlet or circular it has issued, that the entire county has had its proper share of advertising.

In the early part of September, 1909, it held a county fair here in Lakeview, and I think the truth will bear me out in the assertion when I say that no better quality of products has ever been shown on an exhibition in any county in the State than was shown at this fair.

There were products from every valley in the county, and I repeatedly heard it said by parties in attendance at this fair, and some of whom had just come from the Alaskan Exposition, at Seattle, that in so far as the quality of our exhibits were concerned they were as good as they had seen at that great exposition; that they excelled in quantity only, and if you stop to consider that those exhibits of ours, were simply a selection out of the ordinary routine of production, as the fair was not thought of until about five weeks before it was held, then indeed, it is truly wonderful that the quality of the exhibits were so excellent; soil and climate must have been largely responsible for the excellent quality of the product, rather than the farmer, as the latter had not the time to nourish and develop by his care alone; therefore I contend that this fair verified everything published in the literature put out by this Board of Trade. This fair was simply a concrete form of advertisement, a demonstration, as well as a confirmation of what this Board of Trade has published of this county.

And I want to call your attention to the fact that the sale of some of the farms in this valley, which brought prices ranging as high as \$137.50 per acre, was made subsequent to the boosting done by this Board of Trade. The fair alone cost \$1171.45, nearly all of which was awarded in premiums on exhibits; very little being used for incidental expenses.

The gross disbursements by the Board of Trade, up to date is \$3601.27, thus you see it cost this organization quite a little to advertise. By advertising I do not only mean literally, but also by giving the stranger within your door appropriate entertainment, showing them the resources of your community, etc. At this present day and date, there is scarcely any business, even though it may be a private business, but what finds it profitable to advertise. I have received a great many letters in the last two years, asking for literature on this county. Such letters I usually turn over to the secretary of the Board of Trade, who usually mails the parties a pamphlet gotten up by this Board and which invariably give the desired information. As I said before, the boosting has been for the entire county, and the organization has been almost entirely supported by the people of Lakeview, and the expense is becoming burdensome to the few who are still loyal to this good cause.

Now what I would like to see, and I would recommend that every town and valley in our county organize a Board of Trade, Chamber of Commerce or Booster Club of some kind for the purpose of advertising their particular locality, each furnishing their own advertising literature, thus jointly getting forth the resources and advantages which we have to offer to the home-

seeker and investor. Every man in the county should lend his support to some such organization within the county. If there is no Board of Trade or organization of any kind in his own valley or town, then he should affiliate with some booster club most convenient.

The initiation fees have been eliminated from our Board of Trade, so that now it costs but one dollar per month, to belong, and if the organization had the membership to which it is entitled, the dues could be reduced to 50 cents a month.

I hope every one present will become members of the Lakeview Board of Trade.
