New Stallion Law

Corvallis, April 12. The new stallion registration board created by the recent legislature meet at the Oregon Agricultural College to organize and plan the campaign for the betterment of horse breeding in Oregon. The board includes J. H. Booth, of Roseburg, president of the State Board of Agriculture; W. H. Lytle, of Pendleton, state veterinarian; Dr. James Withycombe, director of the Oregon Experimental Station; and Prof. L. E. Potter of the O. A. C. animal husbandry department, who was elected Secretary.

The work of registering the stallions, so that those who buy them may know definitely whether their colts will be pure bred, cross bred or "scrubs," will be begun at once, and the board is preparing to issue such licenses immediately, as the law goes into effect the last of May.
