NEW SYSTEM OF FISH HATCHERIES

Pendleton, Ore., July 4.—A new system for the fish hatcheries, of the state was announced this morning by Chairman E. K. Cranston, of the Oregon Fish and Game Commissioners, before he left for Portland to join State Game Warden Finley, Master Fish Warden Clanton and Superintendent of Hatcheries Wisner on a tour to inspect present hatcheries and arrange for the installation of others.

According to Mr. Cranston, it is the purpose of the commission to liberate annually millions of trout and salmon fry in the streams of the state, where thousands are liberated now. The commission also proposes to make it possible for thousands of these young fish to come to maturity where very few do under the present system. One or more central hatcheries will be established where the fish eggs will be

MANY CHANGES IN NATIONAL FORESTS

Washington, July 6.—A number of changes in the National Forests of California, Oregon, Idaho and Wyoming, made in the interest of more convenient and economical administration and especially of better protection against fire, have just been announced.

These changes have been accomplished by President Taft through a series of proclamations signed at different times in June, but all becoming effective July 1. The proclamations were drawn so as to dovetail into one another, with the result that taken all together they substitute twenty six National Forests for a former seventeen.

The only increase in area is in California, in which two small additions, involving a total of a little over 1,000 acres are made. On the other hand the proclamations eliminated a total of nearly 242,000 acres as follows: 58,000 acres in California, nearly 126,000 acres in Oregon, about 6,000 acres in Idaho, and about 25,000 acres in Wyoming. Thus the rearrangement which puts twenty six National Forests in place of seventeen, is accompanied by a net reduction in area of 225,000 acres. It is explained by officials of the U. S. Department of Agriculture that last summer's fire experience in the Northwest made it clear that many of the Forest supervisors were in charge of units which were too large for efficient administration. The changes are a part of a general movement to develop, with the aid of last year's experience, the most efficient system of fire protection possible at the present time.

In Oregon changes were made in the Cascade, Chelan, Crater, Deschutes, Fremont, Siskiyou, Umpqua, Wallowa, Whitman, and Umatilla Forests and the new Minam, Ochocho, Okanogan, Paulina, and Santiam Forests were established from transfers from other forests.

collected in great quantities. These stations will be located at points where it is possible to get the largest number of adult fish for hatchery purposes. Very probably one for trout will be built on Spring Creek, in Klamath County.

The eggs will be eyed at the stations where they are taken and then will be shipped to the branch hatcheries throughout the state for further development. Each of these will be equipped with expensive nursery ponds. Instead of liberating the fish when not more than an inch in length, allowing them to fall easy prey to larger fish or victims of varying degrees of temperature in the water, they will be kept and nursed until they are three or four inches long, and well able to take care of themselves.

Fifty million trout fry annually for the streams of Oregon is the mark which the commission hopes to attain by next year, and it is possible that this number will be increased as the years go by. By this system it is hoped to make Oregon the best trout fishing state in the Union.

NEW SYSTEM OF FISH HATCHERIES

Pendleton, Ore., July 4.—A new system for the fish hatcheries, of the state was announced this morning by Chairman E. K. Cranston, of the Oregon Fish and Game Commissioners, before he left for Portland to join State Game Warden Finley, Master Fish Warden Clanton and Superintendent of Hatcheries Wisner on a tour to inspect present hatcheries and arrange for the installation of others.

According to Mr. Cranston, it is the purpose of the commission to liberate annually millions of trout and salmon fry in the streams of the state, where thousands are liberated now. The commission also proposes to make it possible for thousands of these young fish to come to maturity where very few do under the present system. One or more central hatcheries will be established where the fish eggs will be
