Four men were killed and fourteen others seriously injured in an explosion in Illinois Steel Works at Joliet, Ill.

He was 24 years old and came to the state from Denver last fall. He had in that short time become one of the best known drivers in the state.

President Taft has vetoed the statehood bill for the admission of New Mexico and Arizona, on the ground of his displeasure regarding the recall provision in the new constitution advising to judge of the state supreme court.

A Tacoma hotel man is under arrest charged with having violated the state law requiring the sheets on beds to be 90 inches long and 81 inches wide. He is fighting the case and says he will rot in jail before he will pay one cent of fine.
