An Oregon fruit grower has produced a white huckleberry.

The fruit crop at Forest Grove is heavy this year as usual.

Eugene has some building permits for the past month of over \$113,000.

A sash and door plant burned at Corvallis. Loss \$10,000. Will be rebuilt.

A new depot has been started at Agency Plains on the Oregon Trunk.

A new Federal Building is being erected at La Grande to cost \$50,000.

1,890,000 pounds of wool was produced this year in Oregon. Value \$250,000.

Sherwood, Oregon, is to have a newspaper under the management of Edward Sheberd.

A new telephone line is being built in Union and Willowa Counties for the use of the farmers.

A carload of the wonderful apples grown in Oregon will be shown at the Pittsburg Land Show.

After a 32,000 mile journey the Abbot-Detroit "Bull dog" passed through Riddle, Oregon, last week.

\$1,000 for half an acre of fruit is the price received by Conro Fiero for his wealthy apples this year, at Medford.

A poker player at Hood River got the cash when the sheriff made a recent raid. That boy was never foolish.

The rural mail carriers had a fine time at their convention in Eugene last week. Congressman Hawley addressed them.

J. Scott Taylor, of the Klamath Express, has retired and A. C. Wrenn takes charge and ownership of the paper.

Willowa County has improved the race track at the Fair Grounds at a cost of over \$2,000. They will use it October 2.

Pleasure seekers with a penchant for hard work scaled the summit of Mt. Joseph in Willowa County and planted a flag there.

Madras people have a fine flow of water in their well struck last week. They are going deeper and will supply the town from it.

Biplane ascensions are the rage at Albany also. Wm. Crawford made some successful flights at the fair grounds last week.

An era of development is taking place at Hermiston, Oregon. A large land company is going to improve their lands before they sell them.

Displays will be shipped to the East free by the "Hill" lines who also offer large prizes to growers of both irrigated and unirrigated products.

There are a lot of likely candidates looming up on the horizon looking for the nomination to Congress from the new district in Eastern Oregon.

"I believe I have practically a blight proof tomato," says J. C. Snyder, of Underwood, Wash. This is after five years experimenting in this line.

Dairying will have an impetus when the Clackamas County Fair shows what is being done there or that is possible in that section of the state.

Portland's rapid growth in population, bank clearances, realty transfers, postal receipts, cereal shipments and building plans lead the coast cities.

The Northwest grain crop is the best ever harvested in Oregon, Wash., Idaho and Montana. Wheat in many places will go as high as 64 pounds in a bushel.

Favoring uniform divorce laws, the same to be submitted to a board of governors of all the states, is the move for which Governor West has zone on record.

The Oregon Trunk is expected into Bend, November 1. The people are going to cut up some at that time and expect to see some real boosters from Lakeview.

Red-headed girls and lightning bugs are the only moving objects that won't have to carry lights if the new motor vehicle laws are construed properly; according to the Oregon Journal.

Frost has been reported in many points in Nebraska, Iowa, Missouri and Kansas. At Creighton, Neb., the water froze ice and tomato plants and kindred vegetables were killed.

After losing a valuable diamond in the Willamette River while boating, the husband of Mrs. J. C. Austin recovered it with the aid of a pocket attached to a pole, in fifteen feet of water.

The Bend First National Bank will import two or three carloads of sows for breeding purposes, that will be sold to farmers on credit, to increase the production of pork that is now being imported into the state from the East. This is a move that will prove profitable to both bank and producer and is worthy of emulation.

Filing articles of incorporation in the Secretary of State's office, the Terminal Railroad Co. intends to build from Sunset Bay, through North Bend and Marshfield to a point in Coos County.

The dairy leads in farm investment according to a recent report of the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Oregon needs dairymen more than any other state in the Union and the opening is the best here.

For twenty years the editor of the Valley Record at Ashland, E. J. Kaiser, its able editor has given up the pen and is succeeded by C. B. Wolf, an experienced newspaper man. Ill health is the reason of Mr. Kaiser's retirement. Here is hoping he gets better with each day's rest.

Marjorie Mahr, who had the misfortune to lose her legs in an accident some time since, and who had a hotel bought for her by sympathizing friends, has the added misfortune to have a serious fire destroy \$10,000 worth of the hotel recently. The insurance will cover the loss but it is believed that she has troubles enough for one girl.

Governor West will be one of the thirteen Governors of Western States that will travel in the "Governors Special" consisting of a train of exhibits that will be taken East to show what the West really amounts to when it comes to men and products. The Special will leave Omaha on Oct. 20, and go to Chicago, Pittsburg, New York and other points where lectures and exhibits will be a feature. 4000 miles will be covered.

Crook county will have a big fair and livestock show lasting from October 11 to 14. Preparations to gather a comprehensive exhibit of the products of Oregon for the show have already started and each of the four largest cities of the county, Prineville, Bend, Redmond and Madras, will have one day at the fair. The exhibits to be shown will be sent to Chicago and New York after the fair closes for exhibition at the big land shows next winter.
