APPOINTMENTS TO NAVAL ACADEMY

Senator Bourne Will Ap-
point One Principal and
Three Alternates

Senator Bourne announces he has the appointment of one principal and three alternates at the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis. Arrangements have been made whereby Dr. W. T. Foster, president of Reed Institute, will direct the qualifying examination. Examinations will be held Saturday, October 14, at 9 a. m. at the Reed College building, Eleventh and Jefferson streets, Portland. Candidates must be between the ages of 16 and 20 and will be given a strict physical examination in addition to the mental test. Candidates will be examined in the following subjects: English, United States History, Geography, Arithmetic, Algebra and Geometry. Dr. Frank Loxley Griffin, professor of mathematics in Reed college, will assist Dr. Foster in the qualifying tests. Those having the highest averages will receive the appointment. But one day will be given for the tests.

CONSERVING THE POOR HOMESTEADER

Instead of making the homestead laws more liberal, it seems that Uncle Sam wants more people to go to Canada where they can get land by three years' residence. On August 4 Acting Secretary of the Interior Samuel Adams issued instructions to U. S. land office registers and receivers relating to constructive residence, the gist of his ruling being contained in the following paragraphs:

"In the matter of proof submitted under the homestead law, it seems that practice has existed of according to entrvmen, where residence is begun within six months following the date of the entry, credit for residence beginning with the date of the entry. He is thus permitted to secure title on proof of residence for a period of only four years and six months.

"After a most careful and mature consideration of this matter I feel it my duty to disregard the erroneous practice heretofore obtaining in your office and to direct that you exact of homestead entrvmen proof of residence for the full period of five years, as required by the statute, before the same can be approved as a basis for the issuance of patent thereon. Because of the long practice heretofore prevailing, I believe it right and proper to give ample time for notice of the contemplated change before putting the same into effect. I have, therefore, to advise you that in all instances where ordinary final proof is submitted under the homestead laws on or after the 1st day of December next, the law as above interpreted be followed."

Valley Falls Items

E. F. Free, Physicist of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, finished his examinations of the Lake Abert and Alkali Lake regions, in connection with the mineral deposits there.

The second well bored here reached a depth of 350 feet. On account of insufficient casing, and the lower walls caving in, the well will not be completed until more casing arrives. After casing the surface waters off to 80 feet, the lower waters have risen to within a few feet of the surface. George Ede, who drilled these wells, left Sunday for a short stay in the Goose Lake Valley, where he has a well to drill.

LIGHTS ONLY ON MOTOR VEHICLES

New Law Does Not Apply to Wagons and Buggies, Says Olcott

According to Secretary of State Olcott, farmers will not be required, under the new motor vehicle law, to equip their wagons and carriages with lights. He said:

"It is the opinion of the office that the intent of this law was to include in its provisions only vehicles drawn by motor power, exempting therefrom all vehicles drawn or propelled by other than motor power.

"It is provided in section 33 of said law:

"This act shall be known as the Oregon motor vehicle law, etc., showing that it is intended to apply especially to motor vehicles, and in section 34: 'The purpose, object and intent of this act is to provide a comprehensive system for the regulation of all motor vehicles in this state, except to traction engines, road rollers, fire wagons and fire engines.'

"While I have noticed some discussion in the press of the state relative to this subject, no effort has been made to register in this office wagons or buggies.

"This lack of clearness regarding the matter of lights is only one of many ambiguities contained in this new law and renders it hard of understanding. On some of its provisions, I know attorneys to disagree and therefore, a poor ordinary man should not feel embarrassed or humiliated should he be not able to elucidate its complex provisions or follow it through its devious and serpentine channels."
