KLAMITH-NATRON CUTOFF IN 1913

General Manager Calvin **Announces Completion** In Eighteen Months

Assurances that the Natron-Klamath utoff of the Southern Pacific, which is to reduce the running time of trains between Portland and San Francisco to 26 hours, will be completed early in 1913 and that the proposed line from Eugene to Coos Bay will be started Tops are now ready and rushed to completion as early as practicable, were given by E. E. Calvin, vice-president and general manager of the Southern Pacific who arrived in Portland last week.

"It is our intention to start the work on the Coos Bay line as early as possioble," he said, "It is one of the first things that must be done. We are ready Misses' Low Cut Shoes to do it, and only have preliminaries to complete before we can begin actual at prices too low to

forward rapidly, he reported. Recent contracts on that project will provide activity until the end of the present fiscal year. Appropriations have been provided for completion of the entire cutoff and the construction will be authorized as rapidly as progress requires.

"I expect the Natron-Klamath line to be finished in a year and a half." said Mr. Calvin. "It may be done soon after the beginning of 1913."
