### WIFE MURDERED BY INSANE HUSBAND

**Warned of Danger Refuses to Forsake Him and Pays Penalty**

E. R. Patch Monday evening returned from Portland where he was called two weeks ago by the death of his sister, Mrs. Irving A. Millichamp, and her husband. The sad affair occurred in the Stanley apartments, 701 Washington street, sometime Monday evening, although the bodies were not discovered until Wednesday morning. It is presumed that Millichamp was over-anxious and while his wife was playing at the piano he shot her over the right ear with a 38-caliber revolver and immediately afterwards shot himself in the right temple, dropping beside his wife.

It has been subsequently learned that Millichamp had requested his wife to commit suicide with him, and although warned of her danger Mrs. Millichamp refused to leave him, feeling that she could perhaps save him from going insane. She therefore remained with him to the last.

Millichamp was employed as city salesman of the Standard Oil Co., and was an exceptionally fine young man of exemplary habits, being about 32 years old, while his wife was six years his junior. Mrs. Millichamp's maiden name was Bethel McCov Patch, being a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. V. D. Patch, who live in St. Joseph, Mo. Mr. Patch is an artist of national reputation, and the family tree dates back to the 16th century. In a portfolio treasured by the young wife were photographs and drawings with explanatory notes, showing the ancestors of her family to have come to America before the Revolution.

### KLAMATH-NATRON CUTOFF IN 1913

**General Manager Calvin Announces Completion In Eighteen Months**

Assurances that the Natron-Klamath cutoff of the Southern Pacific, which is to reduce the running time of trains between Portland and San Francisco to 26 hours, will be completed early in 1913 and that the proposed line from Eugene to Coos Bay will be started and rushed to completion as early as practicable, were given by E. E. Calvin, vice-president and general manager of the Southern Pacific who arrived in Portland last week.

"It is our intention to start the work on the Coos Bay line as early as possible," he said. "It is one of the first things that must be done. We are ready to do it, and only have preliminaries to complete before we can begin actual operations."

The Natron-Klamath work is going forward rapidly, he reported. Recent contracts on that project will provide activity until the end of the present fiscal year. Appropriations have been provided for completion of the entire cutoff and the construction will be authorized as rapidly as progress requires.

"I expect the Natron-Klamath line to be finished in a year and a half," said Mr. Calvin. "It may be done soon after the beginning of 1913."
