In the matter of holding autopsies: It appearing to the Court that autopsies have been performed when not necessary in the interest of the public justice: It is therefore hereby ordered that no autopsy shall be held on the body of any deceased person, at public expense, nor no claim shall be considered or allowed for performing any autopsy unless the same shall be deemed necessary in the interest of public justice by the District Attorney or his deputy.
It is further ordered that the County Clerk furnish a copy of this order to the Coroner and Deputy District Attorney.

The claim for mileage of Dr. T. V. Hall has been allowed only in the sum of ten cents for each mile traveled for the reason that the law makes no distinction between professional men and others and fixes the sum that each shall receive at ten cents per mile and no more.

The report of F. W. Payne, County Clerk, showing that from July 1, 1911, to October 1, 1911, he had issued warrants amounting to \$426.50, in payment of bounty on 275 covote and 25 bobcats, was examined, found to be correct and the scalps and feet destroyed according to law.
All books of the County Clerk's office were also examined on this date and found to be correct.
In the matter of the report of A. A. Farrow and J. N. Taylor, as road viewers, and K. H. Rogers, as Deputy County Surveyor, of Lake County, Oregon, which report was duly prepared and filed with the County Clerk of Lake County, Oregon, on the 7th day of September, 1911, in reference to the opening and laying out of a County Road in Road District No. 3, of Lake County, Oregon, described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the section line between sections 13 and 14, in township 33S. R 18E. W. M., thence in a NE course through T. 33S. of Range 18E. and Tps. 33 and 35S. R 19 E., Tps. 32 and 31S. R 20 E. To 31S. R 20 E. To 30 S. R 21E and 22E W. M., thence northerly over the unsurveyed land about 13 miles, thence NE through Tp. 27S. R 23E. W. M. to Harney County, Oregon, line being a total distance of 59 9-10 miles. For a more particular and definite description of said road reference is hereby made to plat and field notes of same now on file in the office of the County Clerk of Lake County, Oregon; and the said report having been duly examined and publicly read in open court for the second time this 3rd day of October, 1911, and it appearing therefrom that the opening and laying out of said road is a public necessity: It is hereby ordered that the report of A. A. Farrow and J. N. Taylor, as road viewers, and K. H. Rogers, as Deputy County Surveyor, of Lake County, Oregon, in reference to the opening out of a County road in Road District No. 3, of Lake County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby approved. It is further ordered

that B. W. Farrow, Road Supervisor of Road District No. 3, of said County, be and he is hereby directed to proceed at once to open said County road for the use of the public, as soon as there are funds available in his said District for that purpose. It is further ordered that all papers relating to this matter are hereby referred to the District Attorney, as provided by law, for his official action thereon and that thereafter the same shall be recorded in proper record books as provided by law.

In the matter of the report of S. V. Rehart and Creed Pendleton, as Road Viewers, and S. A. Mushen, as County Surveyor of Lake County, Oregon, which report was duly prepared and filed with the County Clerk of Lake County, Oregon, on the 6th day of September, 1911, in reference to the opening and laying out of a County Road in Road District No. 10, of Lake County, Oregon, described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the NW corner of Sec. 25, T. 39S. R 19E. W. M., thence east on section line to the NE corner of Section 31, T. 39 S. R 20 E, thence north on section line to the NE corner of section 33, same township, thence E on section line to the NE corner of Sec. 29, same T. and Range. For survey of said road reference is hereby made to the plat and field notes on file in office of the County Clerk, and the said report having been duly examined and publicly read in open Court for the second time this 3rd day of October, 1911, and it appearing therefrom that the opening and laying out of said road is a necessity. It is hereby ordered that the report of S. V. Rehart and Creed Pendleton, as road viewers, and S. A. Mushen, as County Surveyor, of Lake County, Oregon, in reference to the opening and laying out of a County Road in Road District No. 10, of Lake County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby approved. It is further ordered that Creed Pendleton be and he is hereby directed to proceed at once to open said County road for the use of the public, as soon as there are funds available in said District for that purpose.

It is further ordered that all papers relating to the matter are hereby referred to the District Attorney, as is provided by law, for his official action thereon and that thereafter the same shall be recorded in the proper record books as provided by law.

In the matter of the report of S. A. Mushen, County Surveyor, and S. V. Rehart and Creed Pendleton, viewers, heretofore appointed by the Court to view, survey and lay out that certain road petitioned for by Philip Lynch and Frank Rogers and twelve other free holders.

Beginning at a point on the east line of Sec. 15, T. 39S. R 20E. W. M., thence through sections 11, 12, 13, and 14, same township and range, also through sections 6 and 7, T. 38S. R 21E., to the east line of section 32, the bearings and distances being fully described on the plat filed by the County Surveyor with the report now in the office of the County Clerk, reference to said field notes and plat is hereby made for a more particular description.

Said road being situated in Road District No. 5 in Lake County, State of Oregon, which said report was duly filed herein on the 6th day of September, 1911, and was read in open Court for the second time this 3rd day of October, 1911, and it appearing to the Court that the petition of Phillip Lynch and Frank Rogers and twelve others was duly signed by more than twelve resident freeholders in the said Road District No. 5, of Lake County, Oregon, and that at the July term of Court, to-wit:—on the 11th day of July, 1911, said petition was regularly taken up and S. V. Rehart and Creed Pendleton were duly appointed viewers who were to meet with the County Surveyor S. A. Mushen, on the 31st day of July, 1911, to survey and lay out said road. That said viewers did meet with the County Surveyor S. A. Mushen, on the 31st day of July, 1911 and did survey and lay out said road, which report of said County Surveyor and viewers in due form was duly filed in this Court on the 6th day of September, 1911; that said report was publicly read in open court on two different days, to-wit:—on October 2nd, 1911 and on October 3rd, 1911. That the said County Surveyor S. A. Mushen, did on the 6th day of September, 1911 file the necessary maps, field notes and profiles of said road, as required by law, and it also appearing from the said report on file herein that the opening and laying out of said road is a public necessity. It is, therefore hereby ordered that the report of S. V. Rehart and Creed Pendleton, as road viewers, and S. A. Mushen, County Surveyor, of Lake County, Oregon, in reference to the laying out and opening of said County Road in Road District No. 5, of Lake County, Oregon, is hereby approved and it is further ordered that Frank Rogers, Road Supervisor of said Road District No. 5, of Lake County, Oregon, be and he is hereby directed to open and lay out said County Road for the use of the public, when there is money in said District available for that purpose.

It is further ordered that all papers

in reference to this road matter be referred to the District Attorney for his official action as required by law.

In the matter of the appointment of a County School Superintendent for Lake County, Oregon.

There being several applications filed for the position of County School Superintendent: each applicant seems to be not only capable and competent, but legally qualified to fill the position, but as none of the applicants filed a petition with his application except J. Q. Willits, whose petition was signed by 253 resident taxpayers of Lake County, requesting that he be appointed as such School Superintendent, and as the County Court believes in the wisdom of the people ruling in all matter of public affairs, the Court therefore deems it to be its duty to appoint the said J. Q. Willits as County School Superintendent.

It is hereby ordered that Mr. J. Q. Willits be and he is hereby appointed County School Superintendent for Lake County, Oregon, to fill the vacancy existing in that office, and that upon the approval of his bond and filing the oath of office with the County Clerk, as required by law, he shall assume the duties of the office of County School Superintendent of Lake County, Oregon. It is further ordered that the County Clerk notify Mr. Willits of his appointment to the office of County School Superintendent.

Tough On Hogs

Southern Oregon's coast country has a unique sport found nowhere else in the state. This is hunting wild hogs, the season for which is now beginning. Curry county people go back into the hills some distance from the coast and shoot enough hogs to furnish a season's supply of bacon and hams.
