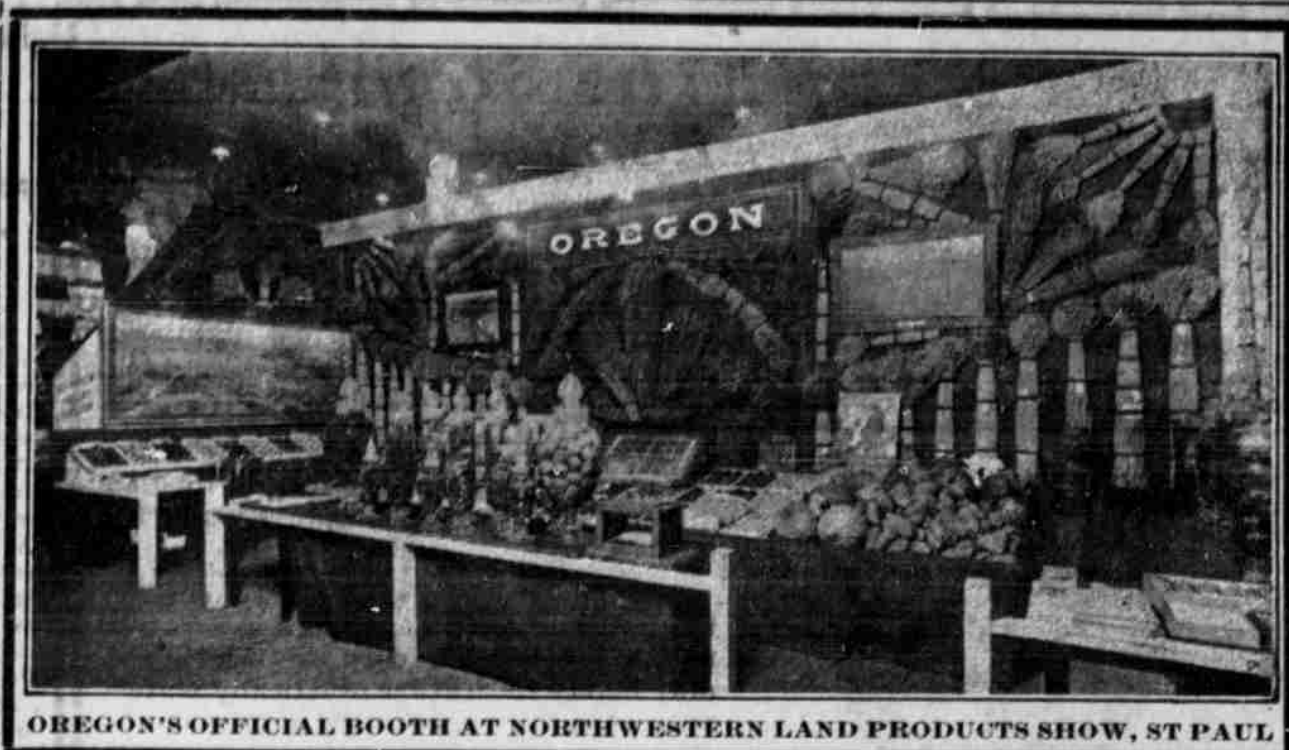

## HAWLEY FAVORS HOMESTEADERS

Washington, Feb. 1.—Congressman Hawley of Oregon, has introduced a bill which he hopes will prove helpful to homesteaders who are honestly striving to comply with the laws, and at the same time to supplement the income that can be derived from their claims by making money in other ways. Other congressmen have seen the necessity of permitting the homesteaders to be absent from their claims for short periods of time, when it was necessary to be absent for the purpose of making money, or of sending the children to school.

What Congressman Hawley wishes to do is to replace the rules and regulations of the general land office by a definite law in the form of an act of congress. He also wishes to make it compulsory that reports of forest supervisors and other officials of the government adverse to the settlers shall be made known to the persons affected. At the present time, forest supervisors can turn in adverse reports and settlers are unable to learn the nature of the charges made against them. This results in a sort of star chamber consideration, and perhaps condemnation, of claimants to the government land, whose claims may be rejected by the department on account of evidence which is never made known to the persons chiefly interested.

## Dynamite Indictments

Indianapolis, February 6.—Thirty-two indictments, most of them said to be against Labor Union officials, were returned by the Federal Grand Jury as a result of the Government's investigation of the dynamite conspiracy. The names of the defendants were ordered to be held secret pending arrests. It is understood warrants are to be issued immediately.
