China Gets Big Sum

The International syndicate of bankers representing the United States, Great Britain, Germany and France, has placed to the credit of the government 320,000 taels, approximately \$224,000, and also agreed to pay the Chinese representative abroad \$126,-000. Next week \$420,000 is to be paid to the government at Pekin.

The bankers intend financing the government or governments until Chinese finances are restored to the normal condition. They expect to advance \$4.200,000 or \$24,900,000 within the next two or three months.
