Secretary of State Olcott has contusiness methods of which complaints are made to the secretary's office.

While there is no law on the statute books giving the secretary of state or any other state official authority to examine the books and business methods of corporations that may happen to fall under suspicion, it is thought the great majority of companies doing a legitimate business will be glad to take advantage of an opportunity voluntarily to furnish the secretary's office with such information as may be

When complaints are received to the effect that a certain corporation is insolvent, that it is doing business in violation of law, or that its assets are being dissipated by reckless and incompetent management, the secretary's office will write to the corporation inviting a showing of assets and full particulars regarding its prospects. plan of business, etc. The information thus obtained will be arranged in convenient form for reference and will be supplied to those interested in the stock of other property of the corporation. If the corporation refuses to give any information regarding its condition, the fact of such refusal will be communicated to correspondents and to the newspapers.
