### SEVEN COURSE DINNER FOR 75 CENTS

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Oregon, April 26.—Tonight the young women of the domestic science department at the Oregon Agricultural College served a seven course banquet to 175 visiting men from various valley cities to the campus, at a cost of but 75 cents a plate. The girls had planned and cooked the meal themselves, in addition to taking entire charge of both the serving and the decorations, and kept the whole meal within the 75 cents a plate contributed for the purpose by the Corvallis Commercial Club.

It was a green and white banquet served at 6:30 in the dining room of Waldo Hall, the girls' dormitory. The tables, set in the form of a hollow square, were decorated with white ceriseus blooms and asparagus plumosus ferns, and ivy vines were twined about the oak pillars which support the roof.

The seven courses included fruit cocktail; bouillon with bread sticks and radishes; filets of halibut with tarrare sauce and salted almonds; fried chicken, pea timbaes, creamed potatoes, luncheon rolls, and cream de mente, sherbet; asparagus tips with mayonnaise and cheese straws, pistachio ice cream, angel cake, and patties; cheese balls and water crackers, and black coffee. In order to give the visitors the dining room on this occasion, the 150 girls ate their dinner from paper bags in the parlors.

The guests, including business men from Roseburg, Arlington, Eugene, Gaston, Condon, Burns, Bend, Heppner, Portland, and other cities of the state, were met at 7:30 in the morning and taken to the Julian Hotel for breakfast. At nine they were taken over the campus, shown the recent improvements in the way of walks, drives and landscaping, and given a motor trip through the armory. During the morning they inspected the domestic science department, the dormitory, the horticulture, botany, plant pathology, and zoology, entomology, physiology, art and architecture, agronomy, domestic art and commerce departments, and at noon reviewed the cadet regiment at its regular drill. Luncheon was served in Shepherd Hall.

The afternoon was given to inspection of the laboratories of the school of pharmacy, the forestry school, and the chemistry and bacteriology departments, the engineering shops and laboratories, the power house, foundry, dairy building, farm mechanics building, stock judging pavilion, the barns and poultry plant.

A few days ago, we received private information, through friends of the Goulds, that the N.-C.-O. Railway has been bought up by the Hill line. Just yesterday, it appears, that this information was confirmed by a report going over the wire here to some of the N.C.-O. officials to the effect that the road had been turned over to Hill; that Hill had purchased the same. The information which we received was also to the effect that the road would be taken over and transformed into a standard gauge road that this important work would be done yet during this season.

This is indeed good news and we sincerely hope that it is true. We get the news so that it was pretty tolerable authentic even before the dispatches went over the wires to the road officials. We are personally inclined to believe in the authenticity of the reports. If this is true, it is the best news that has come to Alturas in 250 years. It means that we will be connected with the outside world with a railroad system which has always built up any country which it has traversed. We also believe that chances are good that the road will be a transcontinental line. If this good news is true, we think that Alturas should celebrate right on the spot.—Modoc Republican.
