## Fairport, The Beautiful, Is Placed On The Map

### N.-C.-O. RY. FILES PLAT OF NEW TOWNSITE

New Townsite Adjoins New Pine Creek And Is Located In The Heart Of Richest Belt Of The Golden Goose Lake Valley

(High Grade News)

The N.-C.-O. Railway Company has filed in the office of the County Recorder at Alturas, plat of the town of Fairport, recently surveyed, on the California side, running up to the State line and from Goose Lake East.

The importance of this movement can only be very vaguely surmised. It means that Camp High Grade, after months of critical examination has received the official approval of the N.-C.-O. people, and that they will now spare neither pains or money to make of this region the wonderland it is destined to be.

Fairport is a pretty and appropriate name. It was selected after many different names had been submitted by many different people.

The town will be made one of the live ones of the road. Already contracts have been let for the construction of a handsome passenger depot one half mile south of the present depot at the foot of Canyon Ave.

W. F. Payne, of Lakeview will have charge of the sale of lots. He is a real estate man of wide experience

and has demonstrated rare ability in that line.

Mr. V. L. Snelling of Lakeview let a contract for the construction of a large wooden hotel in Fairport to be built in Mission style.

Mr. E. N. Miller to whose enterprise is largely due this important change, that is to come to this section and who as Publicity Agent of the N.-C.-O. has been responsible for much of its recent business success, will open a general investment office in the new town.

The company will open a new wagon road on gravel bed from the new depot to the mouth of Pine Creek Canyon.

A pier will be built in Goose Lake near the passenger depot and a line of passenger boats and freight barges put in operation for pleasure and business.

This movement means more for Camp High Grade and this entire region than anything hitherto attempted or accomplished.

## CONNIEMAC HEAD WEBER ARRIVES

Inspects Camp For His Company and Arranges For Active Work

Geo. C. Weber, president of the Conniemac Mining and Realty Co. of Denver, is in the camp making careful investigation of the formation, record and possibilities of Camp High Grade. Mr. Weber is a keen, shrewd, enterprising business man with a long and successful business career to his credit. He has financed many important enterprises and carried them to success.

Through representatives on the ground the Conniemac has acquired possession of the Golden Gate, Golden Sun, Golden Crown, Jasper Wall and Marion G. locations at the head of Myrtle creek, which are classed among the most promising properties in the camp.

The Golden Gate, Golden Sun and Golden Crown embrace a huge porphyry dyke 4500 feet in length and mineralized the entire distance.

The Jasper Wall is a clean cut contact between porphyry and basalt and contains mineral from the grass roots.

## MINERAL MYSTERY AT LILY LAKE

Unknown Mineral Found In Digging a Prospect Hole

Prospectors, miners and experts are puzzled over the unearthing of a mass of mineral weighing about two tons in a prospect hole at Lily lake by Mull and Sorrick.

The fragments somewhat resemble Jasper and chalcedony. Their discoverers thought they were the remains of a prehistoric mastodon. But the entire Warner range is of an igneous formation presenting not the faintest hint of carboniferous stratas. The samples referred to are light in specific gravity, unlike usual petrifications.

One of the fragments is on exhibition in the office of J. P. Banley on California and First streets and is attracting much attention. When suspended in the air by a wire and struck with a hammer or other hard substance the specimen rings loud and clear like a silver bell.

Mr. Branley has sent specimens of the find to Oakland for analysis.

### Rich Find in Dixie

(High Grade News)

Mrs. Tillie Reeder, a woman prospector, well known in this locality and who has been prospecting in the hills for years, and who owns the Dixie group near the Alturas, Mountain Sheep and Big Four mines has made a sensational strike on her property.

Rich rock that will easily assay \$1,000 per ton showing free gold in profusion was found on the Dixie by Mrs. Reeder last week. It is said that the ledge on which most of the work has hitherto been done on this property has panned \$40 to \$60 per ton.

The rich ore discovered has been traced to snow line and will be continued in a systematic manner.

### Gold On Cottonwood

(High Grade News)

Charles Larken and G. A. Strong have uncovered a ledge of fine, white, crystallized quartz carrying surprising values in free gold on Mr. Larken's ranch and contiguous territory at the mouth of Cottonwood cañon, five miles south of New Pine Creek.

The ledge lies along a large porphyry dyke that stands ten to twenty feet above ground. Work will be prosecuted vigorously on the property.

Mr. Strong, who is a nephew of the late Sam Strong of Cripple Creek, made the discovery a week ago but kept the matter quiet until he could protect the title to the property.
