SUNSHINE STARTS LEASING SYSTEM

Banner Mine to Inaugurate Work That Made Cripple Creek

(High Grade News)

The new management of the Sunshine will at once inaugurate the leasing system on the property. The mine has been thrown open to the inspection of the property and arrangements have been perfected to lease blocks of the ground to responsible people. This is a very long stride in the right direction. It was leasers that opened the bonanza ore bodies of Cripple Creek and Goldfield. Many of them amassed princely fortunes. Some of them have gone broke as men do in all business ventures, but as a rule the lease played a safe and profitable game. The best authorities on practical mining are a unit on the theory that the lease is the one indispensable in every mining camp.

The leaser plays for certain profits. He is not a prospector nor a promoter; he is a gold digger. He digs where he thinks the gold is. He prefers to waste a few hundred or a few thousand trying to produce rather than to spend a passing moment prospecting where he does not know whether it is or is not. Leasing is a carefully systematized feature of the mining industry which has produced more real wealth to both parties to the deal than any other phase of the mining game.

The leaser gazes at the proposition from the cold-blooded standpoint of dollars and cents. With him it is not a matter of sentiment, sympathy or sensation; only so much for so much. And the leaser generally wins.

SALT LAKE PEOPLE BUY PROPERTY

Forty Acres of Rich Patented Mineral Ground in Gold Basin

(High Grade News)

This week a deal has been closed whereby A. D. Lisonbee and W. R. Ruby of Salt Lake have purchased from L. T. Henderson forty acres of patented ground in the Gold Basin country near Willow Ranen.

The land comprises a number of mineral dykes and veins carrying good values in gold, silver and copper. The vein filling consists of red oxides, black oxides, bromide of silver, free gold and small pieces of copper. These showings are all from outcroppings and something sensational is expected when greater depth is attained.

Mr. Lisonbee has been on the ground for two months and is now arranging for active development work. Mr. Ruby spent several weeks in the district and made a careful investigation before investing. He returned to Salt Lake last week to interest capitalists in the district.

Mr. Lisonbee has given bond and lease on Golden Eagle No. 1 and Blue Grouse No. 1 in the Gold Basin district to W. W. Ruby and associates of Salt Lake. These claims are on the divide between Myrtle Creek and Pleasant Creek and present a most inviting showing from the grass roots. Samples taken from the outcroppings assayed \$6.80 at the assay office of W. S. Moore of New Pine Creek and \$12.60 per ton at the Utah School of Mines laboratory.

Gold Basin is really a part of High Grade proper. The area is expanding with prospecting and development. The dykes and veins of Gold Basin are really more pronounced, better defined and more clearly manifested.
