SUNSHINE MINE IS PROVING BONANZA
Owners and Lessees Actively Developing By Gold Producer

(High Grade News)
Camp High Grade is now rapidly assuming the appearance of a busy beehive. Every day registers greater activity, and the beginning of new enterprises.
The busy hum is strictly in evidence at, adjacent to the Sunshine.
Both the owners and lessees are getting busy, and now it can be truthfully asserted that Camp High Grade has established, and is maintaining, and will continue to take care of a pay roll.
Henceforth the big dinner pail and the semi monthly pay check will relate their stories of good cheer and prosperity in the district.
The day of doubt and uncertainty has passed. Camp High Grade is on the map. The splendid history it is in the process of writing is now forming itself into legible and traceable characters. The camp will survive the injury inflicted by knockers, wild catters, "Get Rich Quick" boomers, and sensational mining periodicals. Back of the Sunshine High Grade Mining Co., owners of the Yellow Jacket, Gascon and Sunshine mines are Felix M. Green, W. P. Heryford, J. D. Heryford, F. M. Miller and W. Laur Thompson, all wealthy men of this locality, composed of cattlemen, landowners, and banking men. Wise business judgment and wealth has been combined to operate the best and richest gold mine at High Grade. The operations of the company may be depended upon to be safe, conservative and consistent; and at the same time energetic and effectual.

Lease No. 7, Sunshine, held by McFall, Nelson and Ahlstrom opened rich ore on the vein. They are cutting a station to sink winze in the tunnel to a depth of 300 feet.

GREEN RANCH IS BIG HAY FIELD
Force of Men Now Harvesting Finest Hay Out of Doors

The big ranch, owned by Felix M. Green, adjoining New Pine Creek on the south is now the scene of activity. Five mowers and two rakes are at work on the 460 acres. Seven men in the field stacking hay, and ten others are employed in this big meadow in different capacities harvesting the crop.
Mr. Green estimates that it will require 25 days to place this first cutting in the stack. He says that the crop is not quite so heavy this year as ordinarily.

BIG FOUR MILL WILL OPERATE
Stamps Will Begin Pounding on Bi-Ore Reserves Next Week
