Goulds Out of W. P.

It is now reported that the Gould interests have been eliminated from the controlling position in the Western Pacific. This report follows the return of First Vice-President C. H. Schlacks from the east where he had been in conference with the bankers and other interests relative to the situation of Western Pacific lines.

The reported reason for their retiring was the pointed demonstration to them that they either put up more money for extensions or get out. Who has taken over the interest is not known, but it is stated that an aggressive policy will be inaugurated at once. Among their projected plans and work first center placed is the construction of a branch line up through Surprise Valley.

"LUCKY DUTCHMAN NO. 2" NEW CO.

New Leasing Company Finds Rich Ore on The Sunshine

(High Grade News)

A new leasing company has been formed to work what is known as Block 5 of the Sunshine High Grade Mining Company's ground, which ground was commonly called the Schauers and Laughlin lease. The new leasing company is called "The Lucky Dutchman No. 2" after Fred L. Schrott, the original "Lucky Dutchman" and who is manager of the new company. The other gentleman interested are W. H. Shell formerly Superintendent of the famous Strong Mine at Cripple Creek, Colorado, Mr. J. H. Miller, proprietor of the High Grade hotel at New Pine Creek and H. Herseberger formerly with the Moffat mining companies of Colorado. That they have great faith in the lease is evidenced by the fact that while the lease is dated August first they started four men working several days previous to that date and installed rails, ore car etc. Many tons of slide rock have been moved and sinking will be pushed as rapidly as men and money can do it. They estimate that they have from 15 to 20 tons of float on the surface that will return a handsome profit from shipping. Grab samples have assayed from \$50 to \$240 per ton while a considerable portion of it will run into the thousands, the gold being so liberally sprinkled over the rock that a glass is not required to ascertain its richness.

Manager Schrott is so well pleased that he is devoting all of his time to developing the ground having engaged other help to continue development on the original Lucky Dutchman lease on the Yellow Jacket property and which lease is every day proving more and more of a bonanza and sending away the skeptical with proof that this camp is on the map to stay and with practical work rich ore can be found and developed.

The work on the new lease will be watched with great interest by the mining fraternity not only here but elsewhere.
