It was a surprised bunch of delegates that returned last evening from a trip to Drews dam and over the West Side. The magnitude and stability of the work on the dam was a revelation to them, while the vast tracts of wild land over which they passed seemed to have appeared Aladdin like, inasmuch as the view from this side of the lake gives no intimation whatever of the many thousands of acres of fine sagebrush land to be brought into cultivation. And not only that but the fine crops of grains, grasses, fruits, etc., now growing there fully demonstrate what may be expected when everything in that part of the valley is brought into a state of cultivation. Only a very small part of Goose Lake Valley has ever been touched by a plow, but when the land is cultivated, which it will be in a very few years, then there will be such a change that even the oldest inhabitant does not at present believe possible. There is no doubt but that with cultivation the land becomes warmer and the occasional frosts we now experience will soon be unknown.

The death of Hon. Chas. B. Merrick, postmaster of Portland, early yesterday morning, cast a gloom over the town, and left its impression on the Central Oregon Development League convention. Expressions of sorrow were heard on all sides, and the statement that in the midst of life we are in death was brought forcibly to mind. During the two days that he was in Lakeview Mr. Merrick added much to the pleasures of those who met him and with whom he fraternized. He was of a jovial nature and a man whom it was pleasure to know. While not questioning the acts of an All-wise Providence, yet it almost seems an injustice that he should be removed at this time just when he was in the prime of life. Peace be with him.

Judge Thompson, of Harney County is the only County Judge in the district who is not present at the League meet. Judge Worden of Klamath, Judge Ellis, of Crook, together with Judge Daly, of Lake, would have been greatly pleased to have had Mr. Thompson here to consult over matters of interest to all, but at the last moment Judge Thompson found it impossible to be present. The question of good roads throughout this section is one of vital importance, and it is fortunate that all of the counties are working in harmony.

The sudden death yesterday morning of Chas. B. Merrick of Portland recalls the death of the late J. N. Watson, who died in that city early in July under similar circumstances. Mr. Watson was talking with some children when he was stricken with heart failure and fell dead and Mr. Merrick passed away in Lakeview under similar circumstances. Both were men of high standing and both will be missed in their home towns for years to come.

ORE EXHIBIT AT NEW PINE CREEK

League Delegates Will Sure Be Shown On Their Visit Tomorrow

The Mining Committee of the New Pine Creek Commercial Club, is securing an elaborate display of samples from the different mines of the district to display to the city on Thursday.

Dr. Knox, President of the New Pine Creek Commercial Club has appointed a strong committee consisting of representatives of the principle mines of the district to take care of this display, which will represent thousands of dollars in value. The display will be exhibited in Capt. Evans Grandstand on the State Line, at the base of which bins have been constructed for that purpose.

A four horse team was sent to the various mines from New Pine Creek this morning for the purpose of securing the samples. Expert placer men have been secured to pan samples from the different properties for the benefit and instruction of visitors on Thursday.

Eccentric Tides.
