sire to call the attention of the public of the above games in sucn places. to the following laws of the state of Oregon with reference to minors. (Condensed from Lord's Oregon Laws. Section 2142. It is unlawful to give

or sell intoxicating liquors to a minor, to allow a minor to lotter or remain in a place where intoxicating liquors are sold, or to permit a minor to engage in any game of cards, dice throwing, or other game of chance, billiards, bagatelle or other game in such place.

This repeals the law allowing the parents to give consent.

Section 2144. A penalty is assigned for any minor who misrepresents his age in order to obtain liquor.

Section 2145. It is unlawful to peror other public place of amusement. Section 2146. A penalty is assigned

for any minor who misrepresents his The Mother's Club of Lakeview de- age in order to be allowed to play any

> or give tobbacco in any form to a minor under the age of eighteen years without the written consent of the parent or guardian of such minor.

Section 2149. It is unlawful for a minor under the age of eighteen years to use totacco in any form in public. Parents cannot give consent for the violation of any of these laws.

The Mother's Club solicits the aid of all citizens in enforcing these laws.
