San Francisco, Oct. 12.-Luther Burbank is Duncan E. McKinley's solution of the high cost of living.

"Think of the millions of acres that are now waste, producing that eactus instead of the impossible prickly stuff that they now grow wild. I tell you there is the solution of the cost of living. Burkbank has turnished it."

## LIGHTING SYSTEM FOR THE FARM

Just thirty years ago this fall Thomas A. Edison opened the electric light station in New York City. The initial plant, which was the beginning of a mighty industry, was located in an old warehouse in New York City on Pearl street. The single dynamo, now preserved as a curio, was driven by a steam engine and supplied current to about four hundred lamps distributed over a territory about a mile square. The wires were all laid underground. The newspapers were dubious about the success of the new lamps, although they admitted that they gave plenty of light, but Edison himself, coatless and collarless as he watched the machinery was thrilled ith success.

The growth of electric lighting since that eventful day, thirty years ago has been truly wonderful until now the very world is illuminated nightly with millions of electric lights.
