defendants, whereby said defendants agreed to pay to said Lake County, the sum of \$3300 in full satisfaction of said judgment, and said County Court agreed to accept said sum of \$3300 in full settlement and satisfaction of said judgment, and whereas, said defendants did then and there fully comply with the terms of said agreement and did then and there make payment to said County Court of said sum of \$3300 which sum was then and there accepted and received by said County Court in full accord and satisfaction of said judgment, and, whereas, it appears that said judgment has never been cancelled, or satisfied, upon said judgment Lein Docket.

Now, therefore it is hereby ordered that the County Clerk of said Lake County, do forth with enter upon said Judgment Lein Docket, in proper form, a full and complete record and satisfaction of said judgment, in behalf of said Lake County.

It appearing to the County Court of Lake County, State of Oregon, that C. F. Wilson and fourteen other free holders residing in road district No. 12 in said County and State presented a petition to said Court at the November term of County Court for 1912 to establish and locate a county road in said Road district No. 12; that a proper affidavit has been filed herein showing that notices as required by law was posted stating the time and place that said petition would be presented to said Court; and it further appearing to this Court that C. F. Wilson and William Smock, two persons who signed said petition have executed a bond in the sum of \$200 in favor of Lake County, conditional that in the event said road is not established the said Wilson and Smock will pay all costs incurred.

Therefore it is hereby ordered that the following named persons be and they are hereby appointed viewers to survey, locate and view said road as prayed for in said petition, to-wit: S. A. Mushen, County Surveyor R. A. Paxton and M. D. Hopkins, as viewers, and that said County Surveyor and viewers meet at the Court House in Lakeview, Oregon on the 22nd day of November, 1912, or upon their failure to meet on that day, then within five days thereafter, and then and there to qualify and, immediately thereafter to proceed to view, survey, locate and report on said proposed county road in the matter of claims against Lake County.
