

Government Will Furnish Practical Books Upon Application

Many farmers are not aware that the Government publishes several valuable books for free distribution. The books are apportioned to Senators and Congressmen from whom they can be obtained by merely asking for them. Among the most useful of these books are the Agricultural Year Books, that for 1911 being the latest issued. The Government also publishes a very practical book on "Diseases of the Horse" and another on "Diseases of Cattle," and a Report of the Bureau of Animal Industry of special value to stock raisers.

Asking for copies of these books does not place the citizen under any obligations whatever to the Senators or Congressmen, as the books are printed by the Government and paid for by the taxpayers. Many an Oregon farmer has cured sick horses and cattle by following the directions in the Government's doctor books. ## Silver Lake Items

Thos. S. Farrel, receiver in the Wakefield bankruptcy case, came to town Tuesday and is taking an inventory of the assets and otherwise familiarizing himself with the case.

The rabbit drive at Lake last Saturday was a grand success, fully 125 persons were in the circle and 575 rabbits were killed. A few drives like that and the coyotes will finish the job by Spring if you don't kill them all off. The more coyotes the less rabbits.

The trial of the Robinson boys was begun last Monday in the circuit court at Prineville. Gus Schroder, Wm. Currier, Clarence Woodard, Ira Bradley and Dave Dotson were subpoenaed as witnesses and left here last Saturday to be in attendance.

Andy Foster is in town. We don't know what he is here for, but we do know that he had a runaway on the east side of Summer lake last Sunday and had to walk some distance to a farm house to get assistance. A broken tongue and a wheel completely demolished were the result of the disaster. You can never tell what will happen when town boys who aren't accustomed to handling horses start out with a team.

## Irrigation Congress

January 9-11 are the dates set for the second session of the Oregon Irrigation Congress, which will be held in Portland. President Hanley of Burns will attend and expects to bring out important developments in the work of reclaiming the arid sections of Eastern and Southern Oregon. Not only five delegates from each of the clubs and development bodies of the state are eligible to attend as members, but the Irrigation Congress will also seat officers of the State or Federal Government engaged in reclamation work. It is understood that State Engineer Lewis has two or three proposed amendments to the existing water code, which he wants presented to the legislature, and will have them discussed by the Irrigation Congress.

It is said that apples may be kept for two years by wrapping them in newspapers so as to exclude the air. The newspaper must, however, be one on which the subscription is paid in full, or the dampness resulting from the "dew" will cause the fruit to spoil.

## PARCELS STAMPS WILL BE UNIQUE

Designs to Present Panorama of Work Through Each Department

Instead of bearing the heads of Presidents and former Presidents as do ordinary postage stamps, the new parcels post stickers, which is double the size of the other, will present a panorama of the working of a postoffice from rural carrier to aeroplane mail service.

A steamship and mail tender going about its work will be depicted on the 5-cent denomination; a railway postal clerk sorting his mail in a big steel car is the decoration of the 3-cent stamp. The 1-cent stamp shows postal clerk; 2-cent stamp, city carrier; 4-cent stamp, rural carrier; 6-cent stamp, a mail train; on the 15-cent stamp will be shown an automobile mail carrier; the 20 cent variety is illustrated with the picture of an aeroplane carrying United States mail and the 25-cent stamp depicts the general subject of manufacturing. On the 50-cent stamp is a dairying scene; on the 75-cent a harvesting scene, and on the \$1 denomination is a fruit-growing picture.

## WOMEN UNELIGIBLE FOR JURY SERVICE

Attorney J. D. Venator Gets Opinion from Attorney General Crawford

According to an opinion received from Attorney General A. M. Crawford by Deputy District Attorney J. D. Venator women of Oregon cannot serve as jurors. The recent enfranchisement of women did not invest them with the legal qualifications required of jurors.

Attorney Venator asked the attorney general whether or not women under the new law are qualified to serve upon juries, provided they have all the other qualifications required by law, and Attorney General Crawford says:

"A person is not competent to act as a juror unless he be a male inhabitant of the county in which he is returned, and who has been an inhabitant thereof for the year next preceding the time he is drawn or called.

"The amendment to the constitution did not change the status of women as far as citizenship is concerned. They were already citizens. It only made them qualified electors and did not in any way change their condition so far as jury service is concerned.

"It is the opinion of this office that until further legislation women would not be entitled, under the section above quoted, to serve on juries in this state."

## Dam Site Patents

A dispatch from Washington, D. C. under date of Dec. 11, says the government is being urged to grant patents to lands near Lakeview desired for a dam site. This is a state selection, but title has not passed from the government. Representative Hawley has presented to the secretary of the interior, a petition from State Senator W. L. Thompson for his immediate approval. It stated that \$200,000 had been spent on the dam site and that the entire irrigation project will cost \$700,000.
