Strange Sheep Pest

A pest not general in this section has been found to cause the death of many sheep in Yreka, California. One rancher who was in the sheep business on a small scale lost 57 head out of a band of 98. The cause of death was at first assigned to the eating of poisonous plants and grasses, but on cutting up one of the carcasses it was found that while the intestines and stomach appeared healthy, the liver was infested with bugs and worms. It is presumed that these insects came from the roots of those grasses which grow in swampy places and come to the surface in the fall of the year. An examination of the area grazed by the sheep showed no signs of any poisonous plants or other substances.

SAYS MORSE CODE IS OF IRISH ORIGIN

A heated discussion was brought about recently in Washington, D. C., when Professor James Money, of the Archeological Society, stated that the Morse code by which messages are flashed throughout the civilized world, was not the invention of Samuel F. B. Morse, but was of Irish origin. Professor Money declared that the Gaelic dot-and-dash alphabet, otherwise known as the Ugem system, and in use as early as 1150, was actually the basis of the so-called Morse code. He stated further that his contention was sustained by records of the ancient Irish people as found in wood and stone carvings. In summing up his speech he declared: "There were 17 letters in the Gaelic alphabet and they began with one dash, went up to five dashes, then from five dashes down to one dash and then began the dots, very much the same as the Morse alphabet used in telegraphy."
