In the matter of selecting a newspaper to print the County Court proceedings for the year 1913. The Lake County Examiner being the only newspaper filing a list of bona fide subscribers as by law required; It is hereby ordered that the Lake County Examiner be, and it is hereby selected as the newspaper to print the proceedings of the County Court for the year 1913.

In the matter of the petition of E. B. Brewer, P. A. Gruber, W. D. West and others of Silver Lake, and J. T. Rhoton, N. Kemtrey, A. Hausen and others of Fort Rock, asking that a survey be made of the Silver-Summer Lake Mountain in order that a better public road may be made over such mountain:

It is hereby ordered that Mr. E. K. Henderson, of Silver Lake, be and he is hereby appointed to make a survey of said mountain for the purposes of locating the best possible route for a county road between Silver Lake and Summer Lake, and to file a report of his findings with the County Clerk.

Court adjourned to meet January 4, 1913 at nine o'clock, a. m.

In the County Court of the State of Oregon for Lake County, Saturday, January 4, 1913.

Court convened pursuant to adjournment with same officers present, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the matter of the tax levy to pay interest on bonded debt of School Districts who have failed to make a levy in conformity with law. The County Treasurer in compliance with sections 4052 of L. O. L. of the code, has certified to this court that the following School Districts have failed to make the necessary tax levy to pay interest on the bonded debt to-wit:

School District No. 1, New Pine Creek, Oregon, and that it will require a tax levy of 3 1/2 mills to raise sufficient money to pay in said interest.

It is hereby ordered that a tax levy of three and one-half mills be and it is hereby levied on all of the taxable property in School District No. 1, New Pine Creek, Oregon, for the purpose of paying the interest on the bonded debt of said School District.

School District, No. 18 of Plush, Oregon, and that a tax levy of one-tenth of one mill will be necessary to raise sufficient money to pay the interest on the bonded debt of said district.

It is hereby ordered that a tax levy of one-tenth of one mill be and the same is hereby levied on all of the taxable property of School District No. 18, of Plush, Oregon, for the purpose of raising money to pay the interest on the bonded debt of said School District.

In the County Court of the State of Oregon, for Lake County, Monday, January 6, 1913.

Court convened pursuant to adjournment of January 4, 1913, with the following officers present:

Hon. B. Daly, County Judge; T. B. Wakefield, and F. E. Anderson, County Commissioners; F. W. Payne, County Clerk; and W. B. Snider, sheriff; when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the matter of the General Road Fund—the General Road Fund being exhausted, and in order that the warrants drawn against said Fund must be paid: It is hereby ordered that the County Treasurer be and he is hereby directed to transfer the sum of \$600 from the General Fund to the General Road Fund.

In the matter of the recent law which provides that the delinquent Tax List shall be published for four successive times in the official newspaper where the property is located.

This law passed by the Legislative Assembly of 1911, requiring that the delinquent Tax List shall be published for four successive times in the official newspaper of the County where the property is located is an unjust law, for the reason that it places an unne-

cessary burden of expense upon the owners of property. It is particularly unjust to the taxpayers of Lake County, because much of the delinquent Tax Lists on property known as the Oregon Valley Town Lots.

There are 14000 of these Lots in Lake County, and their value is so small that the total tax on each lot is only Twenty-six cents, a sum barely sufficient to pay the necessary expenses of making the assessment and collecting the taxes there on.

The expense of publishing the delinquent tax notice for each of these lots is forty cents, nearly twice the amount if the tax and owing to the small value and size of these lots, it is doubtful of the tax will be paid on any great number of them, so that the county will not only have to bear the expense of making the assessment but will also have to pay for the publication of the delinquent notices.

In order, therefore, that the burden of this unnecessary expense may be removed from the taxpayers of the County, the County Court of Lake County, would recommend and earnestly urge that our Representatives in the Legislature use every honorable means to repeal this law, and re-enact the former law, in reference to delinquent taxes, which was so just to the taxpayers and so equitable to the owners of property upon which the taxes became delinquent.

In the event the law cannot be repealed, then it should be amended so as to except from its provisions all property having a valuation of Fifty Dollars or less.

The County Clerk is hereby directed to send certified a copy of this recommendation to our Senator, the Hon. W. Lair Thompson, and one copy to each of our Representatives, the Hon. W. O. Smith and the Hon. Vernon A. Forbes.

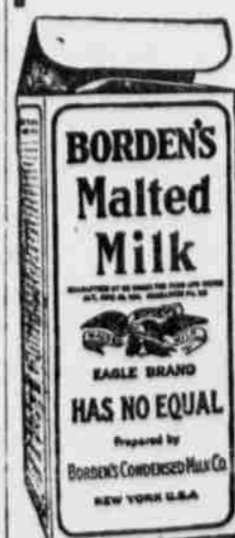
