DEFICIENCY WILL CAUSE HIGHER TAX

Governor Says State Tax Will Be Increased Four Mills

Governor West has checked up the total appropriations for the recent biennial period and gave out some interesting figures on taxation. The rate for next year will be nearly three and a half times as high as it is for this year, according to the Governor.

The total appropriations, including standing appropriations for the two years, aggregate \$6,500,000. The standing appropriations are \$1,200,000 and the appropriations made by the recent legislature amount to \$5,450,000. The amount of funds to be raised this year according to the estimates of the tax commission is \$2,240,000 of which there is about \$520,000 in the treasury and about \$600,000 will be raised; this year through licenses and other indirect sources, leaving \$1,120,000 to be raised this year by direct taxation.

Deducting the amount that will be raised this year, the governor points out that there will be \$4,410,000 left to be raised in 1914, which, after subtracting the \$600,000 that will be derived from indirect sources again, leaves \$3,810,000 to be raised by direct taxation in 1914. This sum is about three and two-fifths times the amount to be raised this year, and will increase the state tax rate to about four mills next year.

HIGH WAISTBAND IS 1913 FEATURE

Summer evening coats will be short hip length.

High waist band will prevail. "Tapestry raine," a new American material, will be much worn.

Ottoman shawls and combinations will be fashionable. Red and gold and such striking effects will be used, as trimmings.

Brilliant flowered and colored linings will be used.

PRESIDENTS COME FROM TEN STATES

But ten states in the Union have had presidents. New York and Ohio have had the presidency 2 out of the 36 years since the inauguration of Hayes in 1877.

More remarkable still, New York, Ohio and Virginia have held the presidency 73 out of 124 years since the federal government was instituted.

At the end of Roosevelt's second term, March 4, 1909, New York had held the presidency 19 out of the 28 years since the inauguration of Garfield in 1881. The presidents concerned were Arthur, Cleveland, and Roosevelt.

The states have had presidents as follows: Virginia—five—Washington, Jefferson, Madison, Monroe and Tyler; New York, five—Van Buren, Fillmore, Arthur, Cleveland and Roosevelt; Ohio, five—William Henry Harrison, Hayes, Garfield, McKinley and Taft; Tennessee, three—Jackson, Polk and Johnson; Massachusetts, two—Adams and John Quincy Adams; Illinois, two—Lincoln and Grant; Indiana, one—Benjamin Harrison; Pennsylvania, one—Buchanan; Louisiana, one—Taylor; New Hampshire, one—Pierce. Woodrow Wilson has added New Jersey to the list of presidential states.

THE BEAUTIFUL WHITE EMBDEN.

The goose is sure an antique. Monuments show that goosey-geese-gander has been following man up and down creation for over 4,000 years.

The Toulouse, coming direct from the wild gray, is oldest.

The beautiful White Embden is claimed by some to originate from the mating of a white wild swan and the Gray, while others claim it is an albino from the Toulouse. Just as the White Rock comes from the Barred. Whatever its history, the Embden is superior in many respects to the Toulouse, and we advise our readers to carefully select brooders to preserve the characteristics of this splendid water fowl, which has gained much in

size, beauty, quality and popularity since it was brought over to America 100 years ago.

The gander should be pure white, two to five years old, have erect carriage, large head, long neck, bright, large blue eyes; stout orange bill, long, straight, broad back; wide, round, full breast; compact, deep body; strong, large, well rounded wings, folding smoothly to sides; stout thighs, strong shanks, toes and webs of deep orange color.

He should appear massive, be not overfat nor thin, nor should he have developed large abdominal pouch nor prominent keel.

The goose should be his copy, but more refined; from two to twelve years old and not too closely related. Two to three geese to the gander is the limit.

The Embden affords a fine quality of flesh, is a good layer, has no dark pin feathers, and its white plumage is abundant and brings the highest price. The goslings are very rapid growers and make splendid green geese for Thanksgiving and Christmas.
