"If our school chilrden, teachers and bird lovers will write immediately to their senators and congressmen asking for their assistance in the passage of this measure, we can at one stroke accomplish one of the greatest steps in wild bird protection that has ever been taken. We can save untold numbers of our song, insectivorous, and plume birds from one end of the nation to the other," said Mr. Gilbert Pearson, Secretary of the National Association of Audubon Societies.

"The demand for plumage of wild birds for millinery purposes during the past twenty-five years has grown to enormous proportnos. In an effort to supply the markets, our woods, fields and sea coasts have been combed systematically by plume hunters to get bird wings and breasts to use in the millinery trade. Many varieties of pirds are in the best plumage during the breeding season and they are killed at this time and the young are left in the nest to die of starvation."

"The investigations of the Biological Survey of the Department of Agriculture shows that the greater number of our wild birds are of benefit in protecting crops," continued Mr. Pearson. "This fight is clear-cut and we believe the farmers, fruit growers and others throughout the country will raise their voices against the millinery trust which seeks to depopulate the bird world."
