Boston, April 26. - Wool has sold a little more freely recently at the expense of values. Dealers are endeavoring to clean up stocks of old wool, with considerable success. Manufacturers are still in a great deal of uncertainty regarding the situation, but are disposed to take advantage of any weak spots in the market. Their operations, however, are moderate when they can obtain material concessions. The opening of the London sale was fully as strong as expected, but this attracted only mild interest there, as trade in foreign wools is too quiet. The total volume of business it is beheved, is really larger than the parties interested will admit. The recent operations have still further reduced the small stocks.
