 Jack Burke and Pat Larkin, who have been canvassing among the Irish residents of the county for the purpose of securing sufficient money to pay off the debt on the local Catholic church, Thursday, returned to town. In starting out some weeks ago they first journeyed to the range of mountains west of Goose Lake Valley, visiting all the sheep camps they came to. Later they left for Paisley passing through the Chewaucan and Sprague River valleys thence through the Sycan country as far north as Yamsey Mountain. On the return trip they came via Crooked and Mud Creeks: They have secured about \$1200 and what is best of all—they state that but two or three refused to donate, and they because of lack of money. After a few days rest they expect to continue their travels, and are confident that the sum on hand will be materially added to by the time they have completed so far as possible the work undertaken. Both are good hunters, good mixers, and it is doubtful if two better men could have been secured. The work is being done on the initiative of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.
