## GOOD ROAD BEING MADE IN BULLARD

County and City Co-operating in Constructing a Shorter Route East.

Frank Rogers, the renowned Good Roads builder, is now working a crew of men on the Bullard Canyon constructing a road to connect with that which he made on the other side of the summit. This piece of road is almost a boulevard and said to be in excellent shape for auto travel. The road that is being constructed on this side of the mountain will all be on the north side of the canyon. The city limits extend one-half mile east from Main Street and the expense of that link connecting with the County highway, which is being constructed under the supervision of Mr. Rogers, will devolve upon the town. A force of men is now working on the town road, and good progress is being made.

When the entire work is completed it will greatly lessen the distance as well as materially add to the convenience of making the trip to Warner and other valleys east.

## BIG ENROLLMENT BEGINS IN SCHOOL

Brief News Notes of Interest From Our Educational Center.

The Lakeview Schools have opened in real earnest and the pupils are in their places with a full expectation of doing a grade of work this year.

Many who are coming from a distance and from the farms have not yet arrived but it is to be hoped that they will be in soon. The grades are not crowded and can easily make room for a few more.

The total number registering the first day was 29 distributed in the rooms as follows: First Grade 27; Second Grade 264; Third Grade 29; Fourth Grade 25; Fifth Grade 30; Sixth Grade 33; Seventh Grade 27; Eighth Grade 25; High School, 72.

The school lawn is getting more beautiful every day, and by care in watering and the use of the new mower it will soon be a solid mat of green.

It has been decided by the School Board and the Superintendent that there will be no more entering class in the Primary Grade the middle of the year. Parents who have children who were expected to enter at that time will please enter them now even though they are not quite six years old. This will insure better work on the part of the children and make the work of the teacher easier.

### Good Forest Roads

The United States District Forester's Office has received an allotment of \$22,380.29, which is 10 per cent of the national forest revenue collected in Oregon. The entire sum is to be expended on wagon roads in Government forests of Oregon. The following roads or routes will be approved as a result of the allotment: McKenzie road, Bend-Sperks Lake, Paisley-Chewaucan, Murderers Creek-Sprouts Ranch, Cove-Minam, Prineville-Mitchell, Gates-Porterville, Cape Perpetua, Lehman Springs, Tiller, Rock Creek, North Umpqua, Grouse Creek and Desolation.

While the roads will not be hard-surfaced, it is the purpose of Government officials to build and route them so that they will represent a basis for permanent highways after the regions about them are opened.


