No. 3, of Lake County, Oregon, said road being in Road District, No. 3, Lake County, Oregon: for more complete description of which reference is hereby made to map and profile of said road, when is on file in the County Clerk's office of Lake County, Oregon. Said report of said viewers and Surveyor was duly filed herein July 8, 1913 and was read in open Court for the second time this fifth day of August, 1913, and it appearing to the Court that the petition herein referred to, praying for said road was duly signed by more than nineteen resident free holders, residing in Road District, No. 3 of Lake County, Oregon, and that on the 16th day of May, 1913, said petition was regularly taken up and M. C. Corrier and A. A. Farrow, were appointed viewers to meet with County Surveyor S. A. Mushen on the 10th day of June, 1913 or within five days thereafter, and after qualifying, to proceed to view and survey said proposed road: That said viewers did meet with County Surveyor, S. A. Mushen on the 12 day of June, 1913, and did qualify as such viewer and surveyor, and did then proceed to view and survey said proposed road: That the report of said County Surveyor and said viewers was in due form filed in this Court on July 8, 1913 and was publicly read in open Court on two different dates, to-wit: On August 4, 1913 and on August 5, 1913: That the County Surveyor S. A. Mushen, did on the 8th day of July, 1913, file the necessary map and profile of said road, together with the field notes, as required by law, and it further appearing from the said report on file herein that the opening and laying out of said road is a public necessity: It is therefore, hereby ordered that the report of M. C. Corrier and A. A. Farrow as viewers and S. A.
