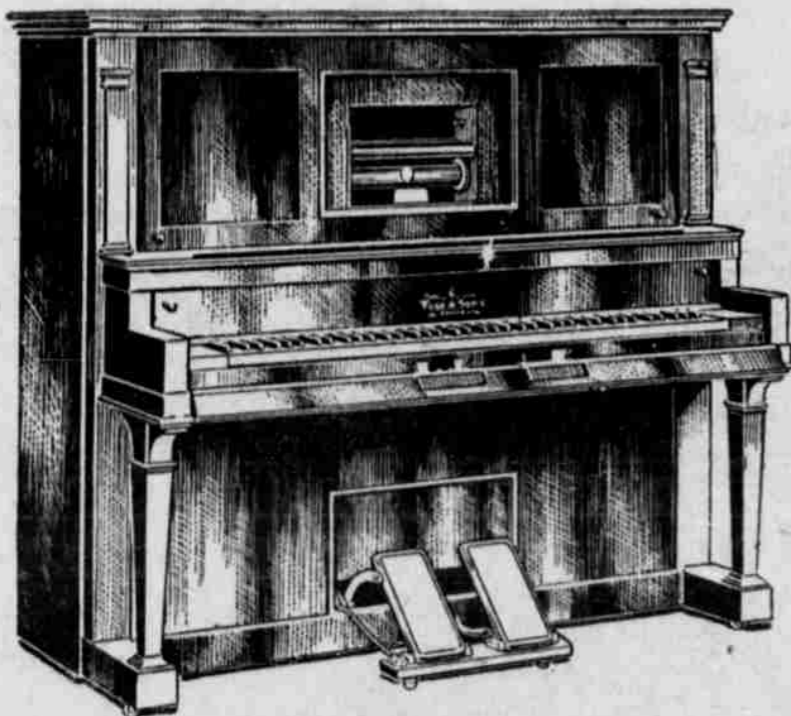

ADDITIONAL BRIEFS

During the fiscal year just past federal officers in the national forests destroyed 4686 predatory animals. The animals destroyed include 206 bears, 3541 coyotes, 133 mountain lions, 62 lynx, 683 wild cats, 64 wolves and 97 wolf pups.

The Government is now advertising for bids for hauling mail between Willow Ranch and Ft. Bidwell and between Cedarville and Eagleville, providing reasonable bids are received to justify. In the event these changes are made, the mail service between Lake City and Cedarville will be abandoned.

State, county and district fairs throughout the Coast belt have been more successful this year than ever before. The exhibits have been more numerous. There is a growing tendency among city and townspeople to see what the soil of the territory will produce and farmers are more anxious than ever to see and profit by what their contemporaries are doing.

On the date of the special state election, November 4th, Multnomah County will vote on a bond issue for the erection of a bridge across the Columbia river. The issue calls for bonds in the sum of \$1,250,000, which amount if adopted is said to be well beneath the necessary 2 per cent indebtedness of the assessed valuation of the county as required by law for road purposes.

Announcing that teachers at the examinations at the various county seats, beginning December 17, would be allowed to elect whether they preferred questions from the old textbooks or the ones recently adopted by the State Textbook Commission, Superintendent of Public Instruction Churchill has made public the sources of questions for the test. One-sixth of the questions will be from the new course of study in several of the branches.
