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"Open Method" For Fractures. The setting of a broken bon should be done by a surgeon of experience. So many irreparable mistakes have been made by incompetent bone setters that no one should take any risks of permanent deformity as a result of their ignorance and carelessness. The "open method" of treating fractures is coming more and more into favor with advanced surgeons the world over. This method is nothing more or less than cutting down upon the fracture so as easily and accurately to fit the broken bones together Not only does this method insure accuracy, but it enables the surgeon to unite the bones mechanically by means of plates, ligatures and so forth, so that the knitting of the broken parts is assured. By the older method of outside splints there is no absolute assurance in many cases that the bones will stay perfectly set, even if they happen to have been put in exact alignment. The only objection to the open method is the danger of germs getting into the woundthe danger of infection. But in a modern hospital and under a modern surgeon this danger b reduced to a minimum.
