Want Big Potatoes

The Northern Pacific Railroad has sent out the announcement broadcast from Portland that its officials will pay \$10 a ton over the current market price, at any time, for such potatoes as they can use for dining car service. There is only one condition involved, and that is each potato must weigh two pounds or over, as none smaller than that is used.

This is being done to encourage the farmers of Oregon to develop the "spud" industry as it has been done in Washington since the Northern Pacific has been featuring the big baked potato. The road uses on an average of nearly five tons of the big tubers every day in the year, and they want Oregon to get a share of this business. They are now paying about \$40 a ton or 2 cents a pound, which means an expenditure of about \$70,000 a year for this one product alone.

An appeal is being made by the Oregon Development League to observe November 18 as "Apple Day" over the entire state. Each hotel is requested to have this product make a feature dish of their menus on that day or to otherwise exhibit or assist in creating interest in the Oregon apple and its uses.
