Gilbert D. Brown, Supervisor of the Fremont National Forest, returned to Lakeview Saturday evening from Klamsth County where he had been the past several days securing statistics on the timber acreage in private ownership in that county. He reports that the official county cruise shows that Klamath has 9,612,595,000 feet board measure of merchantable timber in the county, in the hands of private owners. The valuation of this timber is estimated at approximately

The privately owned timber in Lake county has never been cruised by the county, but is estimated at approximately 272,200 acres.
