The fad of freak spelling was started about seven years ago when "resident Roosevelt issued an edict requiring that all documents and correspondence emanating from the executive departments should embody the forms of "simplified" spelling promulgated by the "Simplified" society of New York. Much contention was had in the head official circles regarding the method of spelling to be adopted and followed, and it also spread through some schools and societies. Finally the edict was withdrawn, after costing the Government a quarter of a million dollars, in destroying and revising numerous documents and forms in the various governmental departments. A recent effort to revive the fad has failed miserably, and now may we hope that it will rest quietly on the shelf of discarded, where it rightfully belongs.
