The candidacy of Gus C. Moser, of Portland, for the Republican nomination for Governor, is apparently being strongly supported in the Willamette Valley and Columbia River Counties, and should he receive the nomination there is no doubt but that he would be elected. He is very highly spoken of by W. Lair Thompson, State Senator from this district, who has served with him in the State Senate. Mr. Moser was one of the very active members of the Senate who worked hard to defeat the new tax law requiring the payment of all taxes at one time.

Mr. Moser has been a resident of Oregon for more than 20 years, and is therefore thoroughly conversant with the needs of the State. During that time he has practiced law in Portland, where he is one of the prominent attorneys. He is of the opinion that by consolidating or abolishing numerous Commissions a large saving would be made the State. He also favors a vigorous enforcement of all the criminal laws with firmness and impartiality and with dignity as well.




