It seems to be quite generally agreed that Huerta is rapidly laying his plans to flee.

There has been no serious fighting of late between the rebel and federal forces, although plans are said to be continuing for future movements. The report that Villa with his forces would immediately advance upon Mexico City, is denied in later dispatches which state that the rebel commander may not make his intended descent upon the capital before a lapse of another three
