#### Editorial Art

Merced, (Cal.) Sun: We happened into a neighboring town one day and the local paper came up as a matter of discussion. One man remarked that in the matter of news the paper was satisfactory, but that it should contain more editorial matter. We thought how little the man knew of the difficulties that beset the average editorial writer in a local community.

The question with the country editor is not as a rule, how to write an editorial but what to write about. A few weeks ago the Sacramento Bee put it very neatly when a reader remarked to one of the editors that it did not take much brains to write an editorial paragraph. The Bee said in substance that the critic was right; that it did not require much sense to write one but that it requir-Oregon, subject to the decision of the thing to write about. The average reader may be very much interested in one subject; possibly it be rubber growing because he may have a American rubber plantation. The genius of the editor is displayed in knowing what to write about and how to treat the subject in order to please his readers. If he writes entirely according to his own notions he is called a crank; if he takes one side of a case half the community find fault; if he takes the other side the other half talk about stopping the paper; if he is non-committal everyone is disgusted and says that he has no back-
