Get Mail Contract

The Klamath Northwestern says that Earl and Mont Hamaker of Bonanza have received notice that their bid for carrying the mail between Klamath Falls and Bly has been accepted by the postoffice department. Their bid was \$6,987, and the contract runs for a year.
Apparently we can take it from the above that no contract will be let for carrying the mail between Lakeview and Bly, despite the urgent protests made by those concerned.

Young Roosevelt Married

The civil marriage of Miss Belle Wyatt Willard, daughter of the American Ambassador to Spain, and Kermitt Roosevelt, was performed at Madrid on June 10th.
On June 11 the marriage was performed again at Madrid with the religious ceremony, in accordance with the custom of the country, the first wedding being civil.

Extending Telephone System

The La Pine telephone system is to be enlarged and extended, W. G. Fordham has been appointed local manager for the company and is making contracts for additional telephones, says the Inter-Mountain.
New connections will be made with the mills, East Lake, Bend, Ft. Rock, Pringle Falls, Harper, Rosland, Fremont, Silver Lake and Crescent and an exchange will be established here.

Will Not Issue Certificate

On Saturday night Governor West made the statement that he did not see his way clear to issue a certificate declaring the nomination of either Justice C. L. McNary or Judge H. L. Benson for fourth place on the ticket for Justice of the Supreme Court because of reported errors in several tally sheets of the recent primary election. Governor West suggested that the candidates' friends in several counties will meet with the county canvassing board and recheck the tally sheets. He said he would then issue a certificate to the one nominated.

Harvester Trust Ousted

The federal supreme court sustained the lower federal tribunal's order ousting the harvester trust from doing business in Missouri. It also affirmed the Missouri court's imposition of a \$25,000 fine against the trust for violating the Missouri anti-trust laws against the crushing of competition.
It reversed, however, the International Harvester company's conviction of violating the Kentucky anti-trust laws and set aside half a dozen fines of \$5000, each imposed in various Kentucky counties.

Vote on Prohibition

Nationwide prohibition will be voted on by the House within four or five weeks, according to predictions made after the rules committee had postponed until July 1 action on a special rule to provide for immediate consideration of the proposed Hobson amendment.
In some quarters it is said the delay meant no action at this session of Congress, but members of the committee emphatically said that they would consider and probably favorably report the Cantrell rule resolution in July.
Hobson declares that if the House fails to adopt his resolution, it will be brought up again in December.
