DAYTON'S REPORT SHOWS INCREASE

F. E. Dayton, deputy county assessor, has completed his canvass of the property in this district and finds an increase of 10 per cent over 1907 values. The meeting of the board for the fixing of the rate of taxation will occur in January, next when the people will be notified by the sheriff.

A large amount of land has come to patent within the last twelve-month in this part of the state. The farmer element on the desert has acquired considerable new stock while it is a noticeable fact that the larger stockmen are feeling the rapid encroachment of civilization on their heretofore almost unlimited range for stock, with the result that the herds of cattle and horses are noticeably smaller.
