For the past two or three weeks government engineers and wood men have been checking up the amount of merchantable timber standing on both slopes of the Cascades on the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, west of Laidlaw and Sisters. This can mean only one thing; namely, that Harriman is soon to extend his line across the mountains through Laidlaw and thence eastward across Oregon. The C. & E. will pass through Sisters and Laidlaw intersecting the proposed Central Oregon railroad (if built) half way between Medmond and Bend, closer to Bend than to Redmond. The railroad will cross the Deschutes on a high cantilever of the bluffs about 100 feet above the river. Not only will it afford direct transportation facilities to this town but it will add picturesque-ness, as well where it spans the rapid stream.
