CAPE TOWN, Aug. 27.-William E. ("Pussyfoot") Johnson concluded his tour of the wine-farming district with great meetings at Cape Town. He addressed a crowded colored audience one night and was received with bands, banners and choirs. He emphasized the boon that prohibition had been to the colored race of America, encouraging, as it had, thrift and regular working habits.

A colored speaker named Baron was enthusiastically appleuded when he said that if the colored people had their way, they would have prohibition in South Africa tomorrow. One day they would push the Europeans into prohibition. At the final meeting in Cape Town, the chairman stated that South Africa was ready for prohibition.
